

SBMH Grant Quick Facts

- The grant is funded through the United States Department of Education, Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities-National Programs
- The SBMH grant was awarded to Hillsborough County Public Schools in January 2023
- The SBMH grant is a 5-year, School Based Mental Health grant for approximately \$8.5 million. Approximately 1.7 million dollars is allocated for use annually, with \$375,000 dedicated for retention bonuses.

SBMH Objectives

There are four main prongs to the SBMH Grant :

- Recruiting qualified Student Services staff
- Retaining qualified staff
- Providing professional development
- Providing supervision or coaching/mentoring to select staff

Bonus Descriptions

Recruitment Bonus/Sign-on Bonus

-All school counselors, school psychologists, and school social workers hired on Jan 1, 2023 and after, will receive a one-time bonus payment of \$2000.00

Retention Bonus:

- Utilizing a scaled-years-of-service model, using 5-year increments, Student Services staff will receive a one-time bonus payment of \$3000.00
- Bonuses will be received the following school-year after completing their anniversary year

* Recipients of recruitment bonuses are NOT eligible for retention bonuses as they will not meet the anniversary benchmark date before the grant sunsets. Recruitment bonuses will be paid in the Fall and the Spring semesters.

Programs offered through SBMH

Professional Development Opportunities such as the following are scheduled to be offered:

- Annual Student Services Summer Symposium
 - Professional Self-Advocacy training
 - PREPaRE crisis prevention and support training
 - Solution-Focused Brief Counseling training
- Just to name a few!

The opportunity for school counselors and school social workers to receive FREE supervision while seeking licensure through the State of Florida.

The opportunity for school psychologists to receive a stipend for supervising interns.
