# FEBRUARY IS NATIONAL CHILDREN'S DENTAL HEALTH MONTH

Early preventive care protects your child's smile now and for their future.

#### Are Baby Teeth important? They just fall out anyway!

The primary or "baby" teeth serve many critical functions for your child and it is important that the primary teeth remain in place until they are lost naturally. Primary teeth

- Aid in maintaining good nutrition by permitting your child to chew naturally and eat a variety of foods
- 2. Assist in speech development
- 3. Help the growth and development of permanent teeth by saving space for them and aid in forming a path for them as they erupt

A healthy smile can help children feel good about the way they look to others; maintaining a positive self-image and good social relationships. Studies show that children with poor oral health have decreased school performance and attendance. Children experiencing pain from decayed or not cared for teeth are distracted and unable to concentrate on schoolwork or loose their focus.

The first dental visit should occur as teeth erupt; around the child's first birthday or earlier if there is a history of dental problems. A home preventive program includes brushing, flossing and proper diet. Early oral examination may lead to detection of beginning stages of tooth decay or other oral health issues that can easily be treated. Many adults are amazed that their children actually enjoy coming to the dentist and are at ease in our office because of the unique "kid" friendly atmosphere. Parents are always welcome to accompany their children back into the treatment area. Dr Paul Duga and Dr Shawna Adams-Feeney are dedicated Pediatric dentists each with children of their own. Their mission is to provide a special environment for infants, children, teens and children with special needs to receive the highest standards of dental care. #### Steps to encourage a Healthy Lifelong SMILE

**Brush** 2 minutes twice a day with a rice-size amount of fluoride toothpaste. **Floss** once or twice a day.

Fluoride supplements as recommended by your pediatric dentist or pediatrician Sealants applied as needed

**Dental Visits** provide dental development assessment & early diagnosis of oral tissue. (Dental visits should be completed every 6 months).

**Proper Diet** Along with a balanced diet, limiting between meal snacks and sweetened beverages, soft drinks, juices & sports drinks will help keep your mouth healthy. **Water** drinking water during the day helps rinse sugar away from teeth

Parental Involvement reinforces good oral habits

**Sports Safety** mouthguards are recommended in any sports where contact with another person or equipment may occur.

In addition to teaching children the importance of regular brushing, flossing, a healthy diet, and routine visits to the dentist, it is important that as parents and caregivers we set a positive example by practicing good dental hygiene. If you as an adult do not brush, floss, and visit the dentist, it is unlikely that your children will either.
