Pledge of Allegiance

flag - a piece of cloth used as a symbol for a nation, state, or organization

Rules & Law

Jobs & Money

Maps & Globe

model - a physical representation of an object that shows how it looks or works; usually smaller than the real thing

atlas - a book of maps

cardinal directions - the four points on a compass:

north, south, east, west

compass rose - shows the four cardinal directions on a map

village - a group of houses, together with other buildings such as a church and a school, in a country area

town - a place with many streets and buildings where people live and work

city - a large town

state - an area of land that has a government and is part of a group that make up a country

country - an area of land where people live under the same government

government - the group of people that has power to make laws and important decisions for a group

timeline - a visual way to show events in the order they happened

present - the time we are in now

past - the time before now

primary source - information that was created at the time under study
