AVID is an academic program that focuses on writing as a tool of learning, the inquiry method, collaborative teamwork, and reading.

The AVID Curriculum

Based on rigorous standards, the AVID curriculum was developed by middle and senior high school teachers in collaboration with college professors. It is driven by the WICOR method, which stands for writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization, and reading. The AVID curriculum is used in AVID elective classes, in content-area classes in AVID schools, and even in schools where the AVID elective is not offered.

The AVID Tutor

Tutors are essential to the success of the AVID elective class, where they facilitate student access to a rigorous curriculum. As students from colleges and universities, tutors receive formal training and serve as role models. AVID students who continue their education in college often return to the program as tutors.
