Just a reminder regarding COVID-19 Symptoms...

## A Message from our Assistant Principal....

It is said that parents have a strong positive influence on their child's reading...especially when we read TO them and WITH them! Research continues to support this idea. Just a few minutes each day can make a measurable difference in a child's basic reading skills. Take those everyday activities—such as a trip to the grocery store, hardware store, restaurant, ballpark, ...and turn them into enjoyable learning experiences. And don't forget that reading independently is important, too. Follow up with questions about what your child has read. So there you have it **TWI**...read TO them, WITH them, and find time for them to read INDEPENDENTLY!

When reading *With* your child here's another reading tip for November:

#### Unison Read

This method involves the parent and child reading together with the parent assuming the lead role. Both the parent and student read together aloud.

**No** one is left behind when we READ <u>To</u> them, <u>With</u> them, and allow them to read <u>Independently</u>. It's recommended that 4th-grade students should read a minimum 60 minutes per evening. When reading With your child here are a few tips:

<u>Echo Read</u> WITH them by reading a phrase or sentence and have your child repeat the same phrase or sentence.

<u>Cloze Read</u> WITH them by reading and stop intermittently at a given word and allow your child to read the word. This helps with challenging words.

Make sure students have what they need (pencils, paper, login, headphones, and a quiet place to work)

Keep them motivated- encourage them to take lessons seriously, remind them that mistakes are part of learning, and that they can take lessons again.

Help them track progress-talk about the lessons, check in with them at the end of lessons, review progress. Celebrate success!!
