It is said that parents have a strong positive influence on their child's reading...especially when we read TO them and WITH them! Research continues to support this idea. Just a few minutes each day can make a measurable difference in a child's basic reading skills. Take those everyday activities—such as a trip to the grocery store, hardware store, restaurant, ballpark, ... and turn them into enjoyable learning experiences. And don't forget that reading independently is important, too. Follow up with questions about what your child has read. So there you have it **TWI**...read TO them, WITH them, and find time for them to read INDEPENDENTLY!

## Media Center News from Mrs. Wenger @LopezLibrary



Classes have been coming to the media center for library orientation and book check out. Did you know reading 20 minutes a day exposes kids to a vast quantity of words (1.8 million in each school year, actually!)? This exposure makes children more likely to score in the 90th percentile on standardized tests. Here are just a few reminders regarding books that are checked out by students.

- Students should handle library books with care, since they are for everyone to share. Please keep books away from pets, food, and all liquids.
- Any book damage should be reported to the library as soon as possible so we can attempt repairs.
- Library books may be kept up to two weeks then must be returned. A book may be renewed (checked out again) if the student is not finished reading it. An overdue (late) book means a student cannot borrow another book until the overdue book is returned.
- If a book is lost or damaged beyond repair, payment toward a replacement will be requested from the parents. The lost book fee is \$10.
- If your family plans to move, please return all books before moving.

I hope your child will read and enjoy many books and grow academically this year! I look forward to getting to know your child this year!

All new this year..... black communication folders will go home every Wednesday with your child. This folder is where you will find flyers, monthly newsletters and communication from the teacher. Check the folder each week and return to school on Thursday. Using this folder. you will stay up to date and informed on what is going on at Lopez.
