TELP Information

TELP is an after-school tutoring program for Collegiate Academy students that runs each day after school until 6:00pm. Parking

Dress Code Policy

Examples of violations are as follows:



- ◆ Bedroom slippers/pajamas/bandanas
- ◆ Doo rags, hoods, sunglasses, hats
- ◆ Bare Torso/Midriff/Shoulders
- ◆ Dresses, Shorts and Shirts Shorter Than Fingertip Length
- ◆ Spaghetti Strap/Strapless
- ◆ Sheer Shirt w/o Undershirt/ revealing tights
- ◆ Drug/Gang/Sexual Reference
- ◆ Obscene/Inappropriate Pictures or Wording on Clothing/Hats/Head coverings
- ◆ Rips that expose undergarments or skin above the knee



Consequences:

Student must change clothes each time they have a dress code violation. If they cannot comply they will NOT be permitted back into class.

- ◆ 1st Offense- Conference w/ student and change of clothing
- ◆ 2nd Offense- Conference w/ student , parent notification and change of clothing
- ◆ 3rd Offense- Conference w/ student, parent notification, change clothing and ISS
- ◆ 4th Offense-**Mandatory** Parent Conference

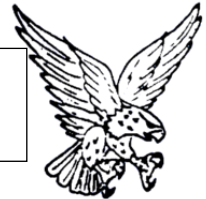
