

Tips for Families to Keep Kids READING ALL SUMMER LONG

CHECK OUT BOOKS OF EVERY GENRE FROM THE LIBRARY

Kids are more likely to read and finish the books they have picked out themselves, but they don't always know exactly what they want to read. Head to your local library, either in person or through the Libby app, to gather a variety of genres so your child can discover their interests.

KEEP A BOOK IN THE CAR, IN YOUR BAG, OR ON YOUR PHONE

Waiting at a drive-thru or car wash? There is no bad place to encourage reading, so keep books on hand everywhere you go! If you forgot to pack a book, swipe through the pages of a book on a reading app to show that reading and technology go hand in hand.

MAKE VIDEO GAMES EVEN MORE INTERACTIVE THROUGH READING

If your child is playing a game that takes place in a far-off land or features different cultures, use this as an opportunity to do research together, which will increase their reading time in the process. 

LOGGING INTO CANVAS

Open Clever



 On a district computer, double-click on the Clever icon on the main computer desktop.

- If you are on your own computer, go to https://clever.com/in/hcps
- Log In to Clever



- When Clever opens, click on "Log In with Active Directory" at the bottom of the screen.
- Log In to Active Directory
 - Enter your username (lunchnumber@hcps.net)



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- Enter your district password.
- Click Sign In.
- Open Canvas
 - Click on the Canvas Icon in Clever to Open.

Canvas Dashboard



 Since you are already logged into Clever, you will automatically go to your Canvas Dashboard. Click on the course you want to enter.

ACCESSING YOUR ASSIGNMENTS

- You will need to go into each course for the assignment in that subject.
- Click on the blue assignment links on the right side of your screen, in the **To Do** list.
- You can also click on the Assignments tab on the left side of the screen.

WHAT ARE THE WORDS ON THE LEFT SIDE OF THE PAGE?

- Those are links to different sites.
- The Home button will take you to the main home page.
- The Assignments button will take you to all assignments for that course.
- The i-Ready and Savvas Realize (Envision Math) buttons will take you to your assignments within those programs if they were given.
