Nature's Classroom February 8th, 9th, and 12th

Dear 6th grade students and parents,

As part of the sixth grade experience, our students are given the opportunity to participate in a three day outdoor education program at Nature's Classroom. This unique program is designed to give students a firsthand experience of the outdoors to gain knowledge and appreciation for the ecology of our wonderful state.

The cost to attend Nature's Classroom is \$12.00. Nature's Classroom does not have a cafeteria. Students may bring a lunch from home or purchase a school bagged lunch. No large coolers are allowed due to limited space. Only water may be taken on trails – all food and other beverages must remain at the picnic area. No glass containers and, as always, no gum or candy.

No chaperones are needed for Nature's Classroom.

Students must wear **school appropriate clothes** suitable for a day in the outdoors. Sandals, flip flops, and 'Croc' type shoes are **not allowed** for safety purposes. Students must wear **closed toe shoes**. Small packs are allowed as well as cameras, sunglasses, and hats. No bug spray or sunscreen may be brought to school but can be applied at home before leaving. On shoreline sampling day, students will change into a pair of aqua shoes provided by Nature's Classroom. Students may wish to bring their own pair of aqua shoes, old pair of shoes, an old towel, spare socks, and a plastic bag for carrying wet items. Students are NOT to bring games, toys, gum, candy, or electronic devices of any kind.

Although this is an exciting experience, students are reminded that Nature's Classroom is an educational activity and school appropriate dress and conduct is a must.
