O Goal – Graduate in 4 years – no 5-year plan


• GPA -9th graders that finish freshmen year with a 2.0 or higher are 95% more likely to graduate

• If GPA falls below a 2.0, students won't qualify to participate in extracurricular activities (athletics and clubs)

Dual Enrollment Courses

• Freshmen cannot take Dual Enrollment until 2nd semester of freshmen year.

- Students can take DE classes and earn Community College and High School Credit.
- To enroll in a DE course, students must have a 3.0 GPA.
- Courses are offered at PCHS and at HCC.
- Dual Enrollment courses are weighted to GPA if student earns a C or higher


