

#### How to purchase a yearbook

- The price at the beginning of the school year is \$80
- Order your yearbook at YEARBOOKORDERCENTER.COM Code: 711
- The link will be placed on Canvas, Social Media, and the school's website. You will also receive a postcard in the mail reminding you to order a yearbook.
- Once the yearbooks arrive, we shut down the online sales and will only accept cash or check made out to PCHS.

#### **Senior Schedules**

- To be considered full-time for diploma and graduation purposes students must have seven total classes (five of which must be on-campus).
- OIf you are behind in credits or have credit recovery, you will NOT be allowed to leave campus early. You will have 7 FULL periods in your day.
- OJT will still be available periods 5-7 for those seniors who qualify however, priority of spaces will be given to students who are on track for graduation

  - ❖ English 4 Credits
  - ♦ Math 4 Credits (Algebra I, Geometry, and 2 others)
  - ❖ Science − 3 Credits (Biology I and 2 others)
  - ❖ Social Studies − 3 Credits (World History, US History, US Government (0.5), and Economics (0.5))
  - ❖ Performing Fine Art OR CTE course 1 Credit
  - \*HOPE (Health Opportunities through Physical Education) 1 Credit
  - **⋄**Electives 8 Credits

#### Graduation Requirements- Other requirements

- \*World Language 2 Credits in same language necessary for direct admission into 4-year universities, Not a graduation requirement.
- \*2.0 UNWEIGHTED STATE GPA
- \*Must take the Biology, Geometry, and US History EOCs
- O Must earn a Level 3 on the Algebra 1 EOC (or receive a concordant score on the SAT/ACT/CLT/PSAT)
- \*Must earn a Level 3 on the FAST Reading test (or receive a concordant score on the SAT/ACT/CLT)
- \*Acceleration Pass an AP or AICE exam, Pass a Dual Enrollment course (with a "C" or higher), or Pass an Industry Certification


- O NO CORE classes will be approved without counselor consultation and pre- approval
- 1. www.flvs.net

- 4. Select the classes student has permission to take. Select Hillsborough Virtual School under the calendar section.
- 5. Notify school counselor of course requests via CANVAS.
- Once teacher contact info is available on your FLVS dashboard, student should reach out to the teacher to set up the "welcome call".

#### College Application Best Practices

- OPrepare an academic resume that highlights 9th -12th grade activities
- O Most college applications are online on the respective school's website. You can also apply to multiple universities at one time by using the CommonApp.
- O Senior Schedule (course codes found on student official schedule)
- Summary Sheet (for course titles and grades)
- OEssay (if required)
- O Application Fee

## Make the Application Complete

- Transcript Must be ordered at sdhc.scriborder.com There is no charge for digital transcripts. Some fees may apply for physical copies.
- O SAT/ACT/ CLT scores need to be sent directly to the school you're applying to. They CANNOT be sent from PCHS.
- O Counselor Form (if required- usually digital)



#### General Scholarship Information

- The District Scholarship Matrix will be posted at the beginning of each month on CANVAS and in XELLO
- O Community Scholarships will be available to students at the end of February. These scholarships will be on CANVAS, available in Mrs. Stephens' office, and will be given to the students in a packet at the senior breakfast.
- O Please make sure that you have not blocked the Parentlink number or the school so you can get important Senior notifications

#### **FAFSA**

- FAFSA FREE Application for Federal Student Assistance
- O For students attending college in the Fall of 2026, FAFSA application begins on Dec. 1, 2025 (Based on 2024 tax return)
- Website: www.fafsa.ed.gov
- OBe sure to use proper website as there are some that charge.
- This is a FEDERAL application and should be completed by any student regardless of secondary school choice (public/private, in state/ out of state, or technical)

#### **Volunteer and Work Hours**

- Students must get the Volunteer paperwork from the Student Services office or a club sponsor
- 30, 75, or 100 VOLUNTEER hours required for Bright Futures (Work hours must always be **100** documented hours but **CAN** be combined with volunteer hours)
- Must be unpaid labor NOT overseen by a parent or guardian
- O Completed paperwork (with ALL needed signatures) to be turned into Student Services to be officially documented.


