



PRIDE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL Uniform Policies and Procedures



Pride Elementary School has adopted a policy providing for a mandatory uniform dress code for all students. The mandatory policy begins on the first day of school each year. This uniform policy has been in effect since August 2000.

UNIFORMS FOR OUR PROUD PRIDE LIONS

SHIRTS: White, maroon/burgundy, or navy-blue polo style shirts with a collar (with or without school logo) are to be worn Monday through Thursday. Shirts with the school logo may be ordered from Lands' End at www.landsend.com/school. When wearing the school uniform, no logo or writing other than the school logo is allowed. **Spirit T-Shirts and denim may be worn on Fridays.** Denim must be uniform in color. Torn or bleach spotted denim is not allowed.

PANTS/ SHORTS/SKIRTS/SKORTS or JUMPERS*: Khaki or Navy Blue

**Collared shirts should be worn under jumpers.*

SHOES: Shoes must be securely fastened and have a low heel height. Footwear must be suitable for outdoor physical education classes and unsafe shoes such as "skate tennis shoes" or plastic clogs are not permitted.

WINTER WEAR: Students may wear sweatshirts or sweaters – maroon/burgundy, white, or navy blue.

Exceptions

- A student MAY wear a uniform of a nationally recognized youth organization, such as Boy Scouts or Girl Scouts, on regular meeting days.
- A student's parent or guardian has applied for and been granted an exemption from the uniform dress code.

Exemptions and Procedures

A student's parent may apply for their child or children to be exempt from the uniform dress code. An exemption request form can be picked up in the front office and must be returned to the school principal.

Financial Hardship

A *Clothes Closet* with donated uniform items is available for students needing assistance due to financial hardship. Anyone needing assistance can contact our school counselor (558-5400 ext. 227).
