As the school year inches closer to an end, important senior dates are beginning to emerge. Seniors, mark your calendars for these upcoming events: Prom will be held at The Venetian Event Center- 9724 Cross Creek Blvd., Tampa, Fla. 33647- on 15 April 2023 at 7 P.M. with ticket prices being \$75 for RVHS students and \$85 for guests. All guest applications must be submitted and approved before purchase by 10 Mar. 2023. All guests may only be admitted with a Senior student. Tickets for senior and junior students at RVHS can be purchased until 24 March 2023 or until they are sold out through "my payment plus". Refunds will not be granted.

Grad Bash will be held at Universal Studios in Orlando, Fla. on 21 April 2023 at 4 P.M. Tickets are available for purchase from 30 Jan. 2023 through 10 Mar. 2023 for \$160. Transportation will be provided, as buses will be leaving from the student parking lot at 2 P.M. Only 250 spots are available, so be sure to purchase tickets soon.

Graduation rehearsals will be held at the Florida State Fairgrounds - 4800 US-301, Tampa, Fla. 33610- on 20 May 2023 at 2:15 P.M. All seniors are required to attend. Those not present risk not receiving their diploma.
