

APUSH Summer Reading Assignment and Introduction to the APUSH Course Due: on or before August 21, 2023

The Purpose: The purpose of the summer reading assignment is to help students get acclimated to reading a college level history textbook and get early practice with multiple choice and short answer questions.

Reading Requirements:

1. Read through Ch. 1 of the textbook, *Fabric of a Nation* (at the link below). Pay close attention to the introduction to Short Answer (SAQ) Question writing and the primary sources.

2. Read through Ch. 2 of the *AMSCO United States History* textbook. Pay close attention to the key colonies and colonial developments (including those who made a name for themselves in history.)

Take notes on both chapters – this is your chance to practice taking notes. The notes can be typed or handwritten but must be in your own words. Do not copy directly from the textbook.
