



Complete a project for the Bevis Elementary SLAM Showcase February 22-26

The Student Literacy & Media (SLAM) Showcase is a celebration of reading and literacy through students' authentic and relevant responses to quality literature from our Florida state reading award lists.

1. Students begin by reading books from their grade-level specific lists. (See reverse)
2. Students create either 2-D art or a video (1 minute or less) to express something about the book. This can be anything that entices someone else to want to read this book.

Examples:



2-D Art- Drawing of a favorite character, Painting of an alternate cover for the book, collage of how the story made them feel, etc.



Video Creative Expression- Students may work together or individually to create a video about one of the book selections. Videos must be one minute or less in length, and must contain pictures, sound, title, author and citations. These elements must have appropriate copyright permissions or be original work. Students may work on video independently, in a group of up to three students.

All work must be the work of students only, and adults may not alter the student creation in any way.

A reader's statement which explains the inspiration and connection between the book and the student work must be submitted with each project. This statement must be at least one sentence, but may not exceed 300 words.

These projects can be created in class or at home, and is completely voluntary.

We will have the **Bevis SLAM Showcase** during the week of **February 22-26**, where all student work will be displayed for everyone to see. There will also be a virtual showcase so eLearners and parents may view the projects.

Exemplary pieces will move to the district showcase.
