FAQ #1: What math tracks are available at Walker?

FAQ #2: Does Walker have a regular track?

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- The *Middle School* track is designed for students to take the grade 6-8 level math courses in middle school.
 - Students will take HS credit math courses as a high school student.
 - This track allows students to start Algebra 1 during the 9th grade year of high school.

FAQ #3: Who is eligible to take the Accelerated math track?

- All students that scored level 3, 4, or 5 on the <u>4th grade Math FSA</u> will be placed in the *Accelerated* track.
 - NOTE: 5th grade Math FSA scores will not be available until mid-summer.
 - Level 5 students will be invited to learn more about the *Double Accelerated* track but parents can choose to stay in the *Accelerated*.
 - Accelerated track allows students to take Algebra 1 or Algebra Honors (HS credit) in Year 3.
 - Grades earned in HS credit courses taken during middle school count toward your High School GPA.
 - Accelerated track allows students to take IB, AP, and Dual Enrollment courses during high school.

FAQ #4: Who is eligible to take the *Double Accelerated* math track?

- This track is for students who **LOVE math**, it comes easily to them, and they have the maturity and organizational skills to handle a high school course load while in middle school.
- All students that scored a level 5 on the <u>4th grade Math FSA</u> will receive an invitation to the Informational Meeting from the Assistant Head of School for Curriculum and the Mathematics Department Head (*date TBD*).
 - NOTE: 5th grade FSA scores will not be available until mid-summer
- Informational Meeting will cover the details of the *Double Accelerated* math track:
 - Students must complete 6th grade FLVS course before the school year begins.
 - Once you take one semester of the 6th grade FLVS course, you are locked into the **Double Accelerated** track, even if you are struggling.
 - The Pre-Algebra course is fast paced and difficult especially after learning the 6th grade curriculum independently online.
 - Grades earned in HS credit courses taken during middle school count toward your High School GPA.
 - Accelerated and Double Accelerated are both tracks that allow students to take IB, AP, and Dual Enrollment courses during high school.

FAQ #5: What about incoming 7th or 8th grade students ?

• Students will be placed based on the level of math completed at their current middle school.
