In Math, we are still building our fact fluency with facts D-I2s (multiplication and division). In Science, we have been learning about plant structures and their functions. Avoid Summer Learning Loss

It hard to believe that our school year will soon be over. Students have learned many new things this year. As they prepare for summer vacation, I would encourage families to keep learning as a focus throughout the summer months. It takes only 2-3 hours of academic work per week to prevent learning loss that often occurs over the summer. Below are strategies to help combat summer learning loss.

Ways parents can incorporate reading into summer plans:

Have your student do lots of independent reading. Older students should read four-to-five books chapter books and younger readers should read multiple picture books each week

Take regular trips to your local library

Bring a book to the park or the beach

Read a chapter in the morning, when your child is used to learning and before other plans cause distraction

Create a reward system for finishing books and/or chapters

Ways parents can keep math skills active and combat summer loss:

By doing 10 minutes of math per day in the summer, students can <u>maintain their</u> <u>math retention</u>

Get Outside! Regular physical activity can lead to increased concentration and thus improved math skills.

Take math everywhere. Math can be worked into most situations: calculating road trip distance, counting change at the supermarket, playing with math apps.


