In Reading & Writing, we are reading Fiction & Non-Fiction texts, retelling a text using a topic & key details & using story elements (Beginning, Middle & End) in a literary text & demonstrating knowledge of the basic concepts of print in writing. Next steps are to continue working on building these skills using a variety of texts. In Math, we have been working on building a community in the Math Classroom & improving on our mindset in math using math manipulatives & accountable talk. Next Steps: Addition & Subtraction Strategies within 20, Addition with Three or More Addends & Explore 2D & 3D Figures. Next steps: learning how to sort objects by observable & measurable properties including size, shape, color, temperature (hot/cold), weight (heavy/light), texture & whether objects float or sink. - Military children relocate every 1-4 years, three times more often than their civilian peers (Farvard University- Center for the Developing Child).
