VPK has moved into a new theme for the month of December. Our focus is on comparing and contrasting. We are learning things such as: living and nonliving, real and make believe and shapes. We are also concentrating on rhyming words, syllables and compound words. In a few weeks we will also include opposites. It is great to see the students engaging in learning and growing. Happy Holidays!!!In ELA, we are continuing to learn more letters and letter sounds through UFLI. CVC words are words created using a consonant, vowel and a consonant. The more letters and sounds we learn the more CVC words we are able to read and write! In Writing, we are working on sentence structure still. We will be implementing a writing incentive called " 5 Star Writers". If a student composes a sentence with a capital letter, finger spacing, punctuation, neatly written and a picture to match their name will be put into a drawing for a reward at the end of each week. In Math, we have been learning to compose and decompose numbers to 10. We also will be learning how to create and read data from a bar graph. We are so incredibly proud of how hard all our students have been working! At home we still encourage you to work on giving your child CVC words to read and write and you can even push them to use CVC'words in a written sentence.

First Grade

Happy Holidays first grade families! Mrs. Zaritsky and Mrs. Covington (Ruiz) wish you well and we are looking forward to a bright new year in 2025! In the months of December and January your child will be reading and learning about changes over time. In ELA, they will read fiction and non-fiction texts aligned with this theme and they will practice retelling the text using a topic and key details and using story elements. Students will continue their daily phonics instruction with UFLI and will be learning about different word endings (__ce (s), __ge (j), __es, __ing, __ed). In Science, students will learn about Earth Sciences (daytime and nighttime sky and harmful and beneficial factors of the sun). In Math, students will be learning how to solve comparison word problems, equality and equations to 20 and place value within 100. Fifth Grade

Fifth Grade is full steam ahead in December! Following taking the Reading and Math FAST Assessments December 3rd and 5th, we are using the data to plan instruction for the coming months and determine student learning and growth so far.

Online programs-We are seeing such good results from students who are consistently working in iReady (at home and school) and Achieve3000. Reminder that students are required to get 45 minutes and 2 passed lessons per week in Math and 2 passed lessons in Reading in both iReady and Achieve. Weekly classwork expectations are posted on Canvas.

Students earn the opportunity to attend "Happy Hour" our weekly Fun Friday incentive.

Getting our Fiction on!- We recognize that in recent years, many students have shifted from watching shows and movies on kid-based networks to watching a lot of short clip videos on platforms such as YouTube and TikTok. While it can be fun to learn how to beat a level on a video game or check out a new trend or fashion tip, students do miss out on practicing some critical skills by not including any fictional shows or movies when they watch TV. By watching something that is fictional, students get the opportunity to predict, infer, summarize, imagine, connect and even further develop verbal language skills. So next time they need some downtime, encourage them to watch an animated movie, or check out a sitcom for their age group!

Students have started STEM Fair and have identified their topic for the project. Please go over topic with students to make sure materials for the project can be obtained. Ask your child for updates as the days go on up to break!
