Dear Anderson Family, I can't believe we are already almost halfway through the third quarter of the school year! Students are given progress monitoring assessments throughout the year to give teachers the necessary information to plan for instruction and learn what skills students have mastered, as well as which skills students need more practice with. In the next few months, students will take end of the year district and state assessments to assess student performance. The state assessments are how our school grade is determined as it is an indicator of student performance and gains for the entire year. Kindergarten

Hi families!! We hope you are all doing well!! This school year is flying by and we are so proud of how hard all of our students are working! In ELA, in UFLI we have been working on making CCVS and CVCC (C - consonant V - vowel) words. Although these words can be tricky we have learned a technique to stretch out those words to hear every sound so we can read and write them accurately. In Writing, we have begun to add details to our writing. So for example, instead of just writing " I like a dog." we could write " I like the dog that can flip." In math, we just recently finished up our unit on 3D shapes! We are now starting a unit on solving addition and subtraction word problems within 10. In Science, we will beginning a unit on the daytime and nighttime sky. We will be learning the patten of day and night, and the similarities and differences in the daytime and nighttime sky. At home, we encourage families to practice reading and writing CVC words and giving them addition and subtraction word prob-

lems. Thank you for all you do!!!






