Admissions Checklist

* All potential students must attend the required firefighter orientation *

A lottery will be held following the Orientation to award open seats. Students who are offered admissions will receive a registration packet with all registration forms listed below AND must schedule an appointment with our ALTC Counselor to complete the registration process on the day of their appointment.

The following 12 items must be submitted at Registration:

1	Residency Form - See <u>Residency Guide</u> . For in-state tuition, provide 2 proofs documenting 1 year or more residency in FL.
2	_ Hold Harmless Form - Notarized (<u>original</u>)
3	Personal Inquiry Waiver Form - Notarized (original)
4	_ Training Affidavit - Notarized (original)
5	_ Tobacco Affidavit – Notarized (<u>original</u>)
6	_ Copy of Driver's License or State of Florida Photo ID
7	_ Florida EMT, Florida Medic, NREMT license, <u>or</u> a Diploma/Certificate dated within the last year from an approved EMT program
8	Original High School diploma, original GED, sealed High School transcript, or sealed advanced degree transcript from an approved, accredited US school
9	_Medical Examination Form - <u>Must</u> be on the form
10	Application for FF Certification Exam – <u>Must</u> be on the form
11	State Fire Marshall Candidate Fingerprint Receipt (<u>original</u>)
12	Payment: Minimum fees due at Registration for all students: \$ 66.50 Bring a money order or cashier's check. The total program cost is \$2,180.00 for Tampa Fire Academy (plus, students must rent their own bunker gear = approx. \$1,000) and \$3,180.00 for Hillsborough County Fire Academy (bunker gear rental is included in that price) You can pay the total program cost at the time of registration OR you can defer payment. Full payment is due by February 24, 2023.
	See information under the "Financial Aid" and "Payment Information" sheets for details. Note: VA, Florida Prepaid, and Florida Bright Futures programs do NOT pay the full program cost. If you are using an agency (CareerSource WIOA, VA, VR, Florida Prepaid, Florida Bright Futures, etc.) you must submit a letter, voucher, or other proof that they will pay. If the agency pays only part of the costs, you will have to pay the remaining costs.
