MESSAGE FOR THE WEEK

Good Afternoon, Eagles!

We hope everyone has had a great first week back to school and are looking forward to all of the wonderful things that we know will happen this year! A huge shoutout to our first faculty Eagles of the Month - Ms. Wood won Culture for Learning and Mr. Williams won Culture of Learning. Ms. Wood won for the many things she has been doing around campus to create a safe, supportive, and collaborative environment for all students and adults. Mr. Williams won for everything he is doing to ensure student learning every day and holding high expectations for all students. On September 13th, we will recognize our Eagle students of the month! This week, we will continue assisting with schedule adjustments for students who are missing a period, have two classes in one period, have the same course two times, or are sitting in classes they have already taken and passed. We ask that you be patient with staff and teachers for all other adjustments. The district switched to a new student information and scheduling system, which has resulted in some delays in adjusting core courses and class sizes. We are hopeful that by the end of this week all adjustments within core courses will be completed. We are working to lower and balance class sizes and make any level adjustments that teachers and students have recommended. Should students need to see their counselors for any other reason, please have your student email their counselor or send a message on Canvas so they may be called down.

All students attended their grade level meetings last Thursday and Friday. We appreciate how attentive and responsive students were during the meetings. As discussed in these meetings, tardies will begin tomorrow, Monday, August 19th. After 8:30, any student who is late and not on a late bus must sign in at the main office and receive a pass to class. Any students being dropped off in the student parking lot and student drivers will sign in at the tardy station located at the gym lobby doors.

Throughout the day, students that are late to class must arrive with a signed tardy pass from one of the two tardy tables. We encourage students to go directly to their classes to maximize their learning time and avoid disciplinary consequences for tardiness. We are aware of the delays students in lunch are currently experiencing. Please encourage your student to enter the lunch line immediately upon arriving to the cafeteria. Any student still in line when the bell rings to dismiss lunch will still be given the opportunity to eat and an excused tardy pass.

Emergency cards will be given out this week during lunches. Please review, make any necessary changes, and have your students return to their first period teachers by Friday. Students wishing to buy parking passes should complete the QR code around campus. Passes will be handed out soon. See Mr. Cooper with question. Also, any student wishing to ride the bus must utilize a bus pass. See Mrs. Walters with questions. We are looking forward to a great week! Enjoy your Sunday evening and Go Eagles!

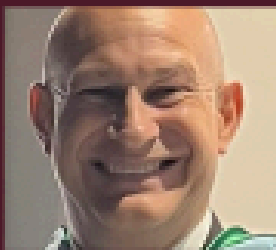
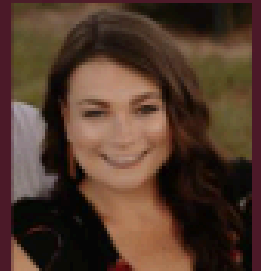

STUDENT AFFAIRS REMINDERS

Parents and students, school begins at 8:30. Any student arriving to class after 8:30 is considered tardy and must have a pass to enter campus. Students on a late bus will receive an excused tardy pass to get to class.

Cell phones are to be kept up and out of sight during instructional time. The HCPS policy states: "During school hours and while on the bus, cellular based devices, including, but not limited to phones, watches, tablets and other electronic devices are to be used under the supervision of district staff for educational purposes only. Students must comply with the directives of school/district staff regarding when and where electronic devices can be used. The use of electronic devices on school property and school sponsored transportation to record, photograph, transmit, or post images or videos of any student or staff without their permission is strictly prohibited. The use of electronic devices with the ability to record or photograph are prohibited in restrooms and locker rooms. Devices may only be used in approved areas and students must comply with the directives of school/ district staff regarding when and where electronic devices may be used. Cellular device conversations and video recording during the school day are prohibited unless under the supervision of staff/school personnel."

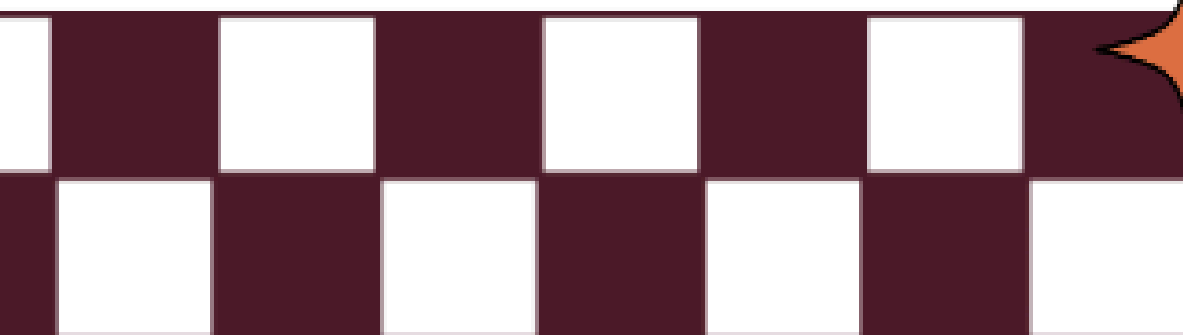
