

MESSAGE FOR THE WEEK

Good Afternoon, Eagles!

Happy Sunday! Thank you to our 9th Grade English teachers and counselors for their help with programming our 9th grade students for next school year. Any student who has not yet been met with and would like to meet with their counselor regarding programming needs to scan the QR code outside of Student Services in the C Hallway to set up an appointment.

This week we start with a regular release bell schedule on Monday. Tuesday we are on a modified bell schedule with a 125-minute testing period after first period. This will take place so that all of our 9th and 10th grade students can do their best on the FAST ELA Progress Monitoring 2 test and so that any 11th and 12th grader needing their Reading Benchmark can test. Any 11th or 12th grade student without a test will report to the auditorium for the 125-minute testing period for a study-hall. The bell schedule is attached in the Nest Notes. Wednesday any 11th or 12th grader needing their Algebra 1 Benchmark will have an opportunity to test, and Thursday any student in a government class will take the Florida Civics Literacy Exam. Students will receive testing passes through their first period teachers.

This week is also Holiday Spirit week, sponsored by SGA and Battle of the Belts Awareness. Monday's Spirit Day is "Happy Holidays from the Family", Tuesday's is "Holiday Chaos", Wednesday's is "Santa's Workshop", Thursday's is "Polar Express", and Friday's is "Movie Characters".

As a reminder, Quarter 2 has been extended and will not end until January 16th, with Semester Exams taking place January 13th–January 16th. Quarter 3 and Semester 2 begins on Friday, January 17th. Any student with a D/F or F/D combination must take their Semester 1 Exam. More information to come the first week of January.



STUDENT AFFAIRS

Parents and students, school begins at 8:30. Any student arriving to class after 8:30 is considered tardy and must have a pass to enter campus. Students on a late bus will receive an excused tardy pass to get to class.

Cell phones are to be kept up and out of sight during instructional time. The HCPS policy states: "During school hours and while on the bus, cellular based devices, including, but not limited to phones, watches, tablets and other electronic devices are to be used under the supervision of district staff for educational purposes only. Students must comply with the directives school/district staff regarding when and where electronic devices can be used. The use of electronic devices on school property and school sponsored transportation to record, photograph, transmit, or post images or videos of any student or staff without their permission is strictly prohibited. The use of electronic devices with the ability to record or photograph are prohibited in restrooms and locker rooms. Devices may only be used in approved areas and students must comply with the directives of school/ district staff regarding when and where electronic devices may be used. Cellular conversations and video recording during the school day are prohibited unless under the supervision staff/school personnel."

Please speak to your student regarding threats. Any threat made, whether joking, written, verbal, or implied are taken seriously and will be treated as real until proven otherwise. There are steep disciplinary and legal consquences.

Shoutout to our Brandon Colorguard, Band, and Cheerleaders for representing Brandon at the first annual Parade of Lights.





The same procedure will apply.
