The Hillsborough County School Progression Plan determines that seniors must meet the following criteria in order to exempt their Senior exams in May: Students must earn a minimum of three quality points in the course, have a passing grade for each quarter, accumulate no more than five absences (both excused and unexcused), and have satisfactory conduct records (no ISS or OSS).


