PSAT for all 9th-11th graders, and SAT for 12th graders needing their benchmark will take place this Friday, October 25th. Students will report to a special testing location that they will receive Tuesday on their testing notification. Testing will take place until around 12:30. and no student sign-outs may occur during testing. Students previously received the PSAT Day early sign-out form, and it was sent out last Thursday to all parents via ParentLink. These forms are due by noon Monday to Student Affairs or the Main Office for students be allowed to leave directly after testing on Friday, October 25th. If your student turned in one prior to Hurricane Milton it is still valid. Please remind your student to get a good night's rest and do their best on the PSAT.

Please note this is a change from our original date due to hardships incurred from Hurricane Milton. Tickets can be purchased for \$40 cash or through MyPaymentsPlus. STUDENT AFFAIRS REMINDERS

Parents and students, school begins at 8:30. Any student arriving to class after 8:30 is considered tardy and must have a pass to enter campus. Students on a late bus will receive an excused tardy pass to get to class.

Cell phones are to be kept up and out of sight during instructional time. The HCPS policy states: "During school hours and while on the bus, cellular based devices, including, but not limited to phones, watches, tablets and other electronic devices are to be used under the supervision of district staff for educational purposes only. Students must comply with the directives of school/district staff regarding when and where electronic devices can be used. The use of electronic devices on school property and school sponsored transportation to record, photograph, transmit, or post images or videos of any student or staff without their permission is strictly prohibited. The use of electronic devices with the ability to record or photograph are prohibited in restrooms and locker rooms. Devices may only be used in approved areas and students must comply with the directives of school/ district staff regarding when and where electronic devices may be used. Cellular device conversations and video recording during the school day are prohibited unless under the supervision of staff/school personnel."

Please speak to your student regarding threats. Any threat made, whether joking, written, verbal, or implied are taken seriously and will be treated as real until proven otherwise. There are steep disciplinary and legal consquences.


