KFF conducted a survey to find out how race plays out in the healthcare system. In their "Discrimination and Health Survey highlight barriers to mental health care, including costs and difficulties finding providers, with people of color citing additional challenges such as difficulty finding providers with shared background and experiences, lack of information, and stigma and embarrassment.". A quote we chose to use in our video was, "Reported awareness of the 9-8-8 mental health hotline remains low overall, particularly among Black, Hispanic, and Asian adults". We liked this one specifically because it highlights the lack of knowledge on ways to tackle mental health and that minorities aren't aware of the options available. In our personal experience we have seen this firsthand as minorities ourselves, Demetrius Hall, a young black man, can confidently say there isn't much conversation about mental health within his family and he had to learn about it himself. As the newer generations come "in, we both realized things need to change. Minority children need a safety net, parents to confide with them when speaking about their mental health and having a parent who knows solutions. With the research KFF did we better understand what holds back minority families and how we can create solutions to bring awareness.
