Florida Cell Phone Law

School Zones

As of October 1, 2019, Florida drivers are not allowed to hold cell phones in their hands in work or school zones. Our school zone begins on Nine Eagles Road and extends through all school property including Car Line. Drivers in these zones should not hold the phone up to their ear, type anything on their screen, or even hold their phone to read their GPS. If law enforcement sees a driver breaking this new law, they may issue a citation.
