Ask your student about the ways they can include others to create a culture of kindness on campus.

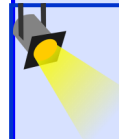
The School Advisory Council has begun their work to make decisions that best support our school! They have helped confirm our 2020-2021 School Improvement Plan Goals:
