### WHAT DO WE DO IN HOSA?

All HOSA Chapters in our district meet and compete against each other in events related to health professions. *This will be hosted at Williams this year!* 

District winners advance to attend the State Leadership Conference for 3 days in Orlando (April 9- 12, 2022).

Some state winners (event-dependent) advance to the International Leadership Conference in Nashville, TN (June 22-25 2022).



- <u>Health Career Exploration</u> learn about five health career clusters & gain knowledge about career skills
- Foundations of Medical Terminology gain knowledge & skills regarding prefixes, suffixes, roots & anatomy, physiology, pathophysiology & occupations related to the health field
- <u>Math for Health Careers</u> improve ability to identify, solve & apply mathematical principles used in health careers
- <u>Medical Reading</u> improve reading comprehension & understanding of special topics related to leadership development & the health community
- <u>Nutrition</u> –explore & learn about the relationship of nutrition & wellness & to assess knowledge common in this health field



- Life Threatening Situations gain knowledge & skills required for handling emergency situations until trained assistance arrives
- <u>Public Health</u> develop an effective, dynamic & creative presentation that informs the public about an important health issue
- Extemporaneous Health Poster gain knowledge & skills required for interpreting & communicating current health/HOSA-related issues in an artistic & creative manner
- <u>Health Career Preparation</u> gain knowledge & skills required for interviews in a health career
- <u>Dynamic Decisions</u> gain knowledge & skills required for creating a solution to a health or HOSA-related problem



- <u>Healthy Lifestyle</u> gain knowledge & skills required to understand healthy living & the impact on health throughout the life span
- <u>Prepared Speaking</u> improve knowledge & skills surrounding effective oral communication (develop speech related to *Unlock Your Potential!* – this year's topic)
- <u>Exploring Medical Innovation</u> gain knowledge regarding a medical innovation that impacted the future of health or the delivery of healthcare



- <u>Health Career Display</u> research a career of interest, create a display board of associated career materials, & improve presentation skills as you communicate your career information to others
- <u>Health Education</u> gain knowledge & skills required to select a health-related concept or instructional objective & prepare a lesson for a targeted group of learners, provide instruction & evaluate results

# HOSA Costs for 2021-22



- <u>Registration for our Chapter</u> \$45 covers district, state and national registration (all required for participation)
- HOSAT-shirts \$15 per student (due at time of registration)
- <u>Club Dues-</u>\$60 due EACH quarter and must be paid no later than the first meeting of every quarter to remain in the club. You can also pay club dues for the entire year (\$240), up front, if you choose to do so
- <u>Regional Leadership Conference</u> additional, but minimal fees may be required for participation
- <u>State Leadership Conference & Competition</u> if students qualify, additional fees may be required for participation
- International Leadership Conference & Competition if students qualify, additional fees may be required for participation
