\*\*Due to the HOST programs' focus on student safety, failure to follow rules will result in corrective action.

HOST staff uses positive reinforcement to encourage desirable behavior. Parents will be notified of recurring behavior problems.

The school principal and/or HOST administrative staff reserves the right to suspend/remove any student from the program for continued disruptive behavior and/or a major discipline offense.

Students are carefully supervised and released only to authorized persons as indicated by the registration. ALL authorized persons must present photo-identification and SIGN THE STUDENT out on a daily basis.

Parents will be notified of all medical emergencies. If the parents cannot be reached, staff will take proper action. A student who becomes ill while attending HOST must be immediately picked up by an authorized person.

HOST programs will make reasonable accommodations in order to serve children with special needs or disabilities.

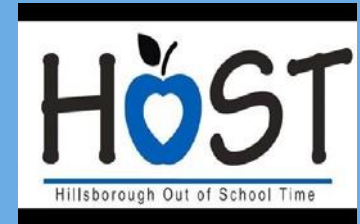

HOST follows a weekly plan of activities incorporating the following general categories:

**Homework Time:** Homework assistance of at least one-half hour. This service is provided through age grouping.

**Snack Time:** Milk, juice and snacks are provided by the HOST program. Breakfast, lunch and a snack will be provided on full-day operations during the summer.

**Outdoor Activities:** Supervised and organized activities including team games, exercises and/or playground time.

**Enrichment:** Enrichment activities include: art, music, sports, computerized educational programs, reading, math, science, STEAM, educational games, story time, educational movies, or other academic experiences.

Money orders and credit cards are accepted by the HOST program. Cash is not accepted. Make all money orders payable to "School Name" HOST program.

A per student registration fee is required annually for all programs. Weekly fees are due the Friday prior to the week of service for Elementary and K-8 programs. Fees are charged on the first day the student attends for the week in Middle School programs. Additional fees will be assessed for late pick-up and late payments. Penalties for nonpayment and late pick-up include late fees and possible dismissal from the program. Additional fees and penalties apply for all programs.

Frequent late pick-up from the HOST program sites:

- 1) Will result in dismissal from the program, as it places unnecessary hardships and responsibilities on our staff.
- 2) May necessitate law enforcement and/or child protective services to be contacted to initiate child abandonment procedures.

Applications for Child Care Subsidies are available online at [www.ELCHC.org](http://www.ELCHC.org) or call Child Care Resource and Referral at (813) 515-2340 for more information. Subsidies are available for students up to 11 years old.

Families are allotted two-weeks vacation. (Aug. to May) and two weeks in the summer. (June-July) Vacations must be redeemed a week at a time, though not consecutively. Fees are not due during vacation weeks as long as parents notify HOST staff two weeks in advance to facilitate staffing needs.
