STATEWIDE & END OF COURSE ASSESSMENTS REQUIREMENTS

Grade 10 English Language Arts (ELA) exam or an equivalent score

AND

Algebra 1 End-of-Course (EOC) exam or a comparative score Students enrolled in the following courses must participate in the corresponding EOC assessment, which constitutes 30% of the final course grade: Algebra 1, Biology, Geometry, and US History

NOTE: A waiver of assessment results is granted by the IEP team for students with disabilities. Additionally, students enrolled in ESOL program for less than two years may meet the requirement for grade 10 ELA by satisfactorily demonstrating grade level expectations of formative assessments.

Additional diploma designations are also available for students in Florida: **The Scholar Designation** and the **Industry Scholar Designation** with additional requirements over the standard diploma.
