

Morning Entry

If you are a car rider or a walker, you will arrive through the main entrance at the front of the school.



The gates will open at 8:10am for you to enter campus



You will enter the car line using the light on Commerce Park Blvd. Please adhere to the one-way flow of traffic and exit promptly.

Morning Entry

Bus riders will be dropped off at the bus ramp in the back of the school.



Students will be permitted to exit busses and enter campus at 8:10am.







Guidance

Masks/face coverings should be worn during passing time.





Certain stairwells will be labeled for UP traffic, and others for DOWN.

Courtyard









We use our auditorium for assemblies, special events, performances, and much more!






Media Center

If you need to check out a book or use a computer, you can go to the Media Center before school starts, or with a pass at lunch.






English Building (200 Hall)
