Every summer Hill Middle School has issued a required summer reading list. Why required summer reading? Studies have proven that there is on average, a loss between 25 – 30 percent of their school year learning over the summer. In order to help combat this summer learning loss, Hill has made it a requirement to read *at least* one book over the summer. A successful summer reading program can be effective at raising your child's test scores and saving teachers' time on having to "re-teach" curriculum that was taught the previous year.

The goal for your child over the summer is to read *at least one* of the required books listed on the back of this letter and pass a quiz. Quiz links and QR codes are located on the flyer. Your child's reading (6<sup>th</sup> grade) or language arts (7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade) teacher will be entering a grade for summer reading. If your child reads all summer reading books and passes the quizzes with a 70% or higher, they will be invited to a reading celebration for all their hard work.

The summer reading books can be found at a variety of places. Some places are listed under the book summaries. Through the public library's HAAL Pass, students can access all books in different formats. The user ID is their student number and PIN 4321. To access books through the school districts Axis 360, select library HCPS Hill Middle and ID is student number.
