Campus Access:

- Visitors to campus will be restricted to the front office only. Parents/guardians may come in to pick up an ill student or receive information from the office.
- To maintain a safe and healthy environment, students will walk to class with the assistance of staff.

First day of school only: We will allow students to be walked to class on the first day of school. We are asking that only one parent come on campus if possible. For those that walk their child to class, please note drop off will be at the classroom door.

Dress Code

Based on feedback from our school community, we have revised the dress code for the 2022-2023 school year. School uniforms are recommended.

The uniform consists of:

- White, navy or maroon sleeved, collared shirt
- Navy blue or khaki pants, shorts, capri, skorts or jumpers
- School Spirit shirts on Fridays.

Required Dress Code if not participating in the Uniform Policy

- Shorts or skirts should be no shorter than fingertip length.
- The shoulder and torso should be covered at all times.
- Jeans must be free of holes or rips.
- Please note the dress of students should be nondisruptive to the educational environment. Failure to follow the dress code can result in students being asked to wear a school shirt over their clothing, change or a call home to the family.

Universal information:

- All pants and shorts shall be secured at the waist to prevent underwear from being visible.
- Head covering, including hoodies, shall not be worn in the building unless required for religious reasons.
- Shoes shall be securely fastened to the feet. Footwear must be suitable for outdoor physical activity. Unsafe shoes such as roller shoes/Heallys or slides are not permitted.
- Students and staff members are encouraged to show their school spirit by wearing spirit shirts on Friday. These can be purchased through our PTA.



Volunteer/Chaperone AppliCation

All volunteers and community partners must complete/reactivate the online HCPS Volunteer Application each school year. Anyone who submits a volunteer application beginning July 1, 2022 will remain active in our system through June 30, 2023. NOW is the time to complete the online application.

From the District website click on "Departments", click on "Volunteer Services" and then click on the Y.E.S Icon. Complete the application. It could take approximately 2-4 weeks to be approved.

Student Arrival and Dismissal

Before diving into car line procedures, a quick question for you. If you knew of a secret route that could take you to work that avoided a daily traffic jam, would you take it? Or do you enjoy bumper to bumper, snails pace driving and the stress of being late to work? Well, if you live more than two miles from school, we have a secret route for you to consider. By sending your child to school on the bus you could realize several benefits to yourself, your child and your fellow parents. Did you know, that in many cases, our students that travel home on the bus make it there sooner than those picking up in car line? Did you know travelling to school by bus can help your student develop a feeling of confidence and independence? If you are eligible to send your student by bus and choose to do so, you would help relieve the crowding of the car line to the benefit of your fellow parents that are not eligible to send their students by bus. Imagine what you might be able to do with all the time saved not waiting in a car line? I get it, seeing our smiling faces welcoming your wonderful children to school each day is certainly worth the wait, but if eligible why not try out the school bus.

If the school bus is not an option, please be patient with our car line. Especially for the first two weeks of school, it can be a slow process. Your student's safety is the first priority. Your courtesy with other parents and local businesses leading up to car line is greatly appreciated.
