## February is Black History Month

Black History Month, also known as African American History Month, takes place every February to honor the accomplishments of Black people in the United States and the important roles they have played in the past and the present. During the month of February, we will have a heightened emphasis on exploring historical as well as current figures in our society who have or are positively contributing to the advancement of equality and fairness for all.



Kamala Harris was born on October 20, 1964, in Oakland, California. She is the daughter of immigrants-her father was from Jamaica, and her mother was from India. Harris and her sister were raised in the San Francisco Bay area of California, She graduated from Howard University in Washington DC in 1986. She graduated from the University of California, Hastings College of Law in San Francisco in 1989.

In 2016 she was elected to the United States Senate. Harris was the first Indian American to serve as a U.S. senator. She was also the second Black woman to do so.

In August 2020 Joe Biden picked Harris as his vice presidential candidate for the 2020 presidential election. It was the fourth time a woman appeared on a Democratic or Republican presidential ticket. Biden and Harris won the election in November. Harris officially became the vice president of the United States on January 20, 2021.
