Dress Code Policy

Examples of violations are as follows:

- ⇒ Doo rags, hoods, sunglasses, hats
- ⇒ Bare Torso/Midriff/Shoulders
- ⇒ Dresses, Shorts and Shirts Shorter Than Fingertip Length
- ⇒ Spaghetti Strap/Strapless
- ⇒ Sheer Shirt w/o Undershirt/ revealing tights
- ⇒ Drug/Gang/Sexual Reference
- ⇒ Obscene/Inappropriate Pictures or Wording on Clothing/Hats/Head coverings
- ⇒ Rips that expose undergarments or skin above the knee

Consequences:

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL PARENTS AND STUDENTS

State Law requires that students, 14 to 18 years of age, who have not earned a high school diploma, who have 15 unexcused absences in any period of 90 calendar days, be *ineligible* for driving privileges. These absences *do not* have to be in succession. School districts are required by this legislation to report to the State of Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV), the names of students who have accumulated 15 unexcused absences in any period of 90 calendar days. Effective January 5, 1999, students who accumulate 15 unexcused absences in any period of 90 calendar days will be reported by the school to the DHSMV. The student who is reported will be informed by the DHSMV that his/her name has been received and he/she may lose the privilege to drive. Should a student be contacted by DHSMV with information, he/she may initiate a request for a hardship waiver or a request for reinstatement of driving privilege through the Office of Student Affairs. Students who fall under this initiative must surrender their parking decal and find alternative means of transportation, i.e., bus rider or parent drop off.

Attendance

All students are expected to be in their first period class by 8:40 a.m. If a student is absent for the day, a parent must call the attendance line at **744-8040 option #1** and follow the voice prompts for leaving a message to excuse the absence by 10:00a.m. Acceptable excuses for absences are covered in the student handbook available at http://www.sdhc.k12.fl.us/assets/pdf/studenthandbook.pdf. Parents will still receive a phone call whether excused or unex-

Parking

- Pick-Up/Drop Off—Students pick up and drop off is located in the back of the school. Students may not be dropped off in the front of the school and out front by the baseball field. Students may not arrive on campus before 8:05 a.m, must enter through side gate, front doors will be locked. There will be no supervision before that time.
- Student Parking—All students will be parking in designated spaces in the back of the school. Due to safety concerns, the back parking area will be closed throughout the day to all incoming/outgoing traffic.
- Parking Decals— Use the QR Code to complete required information and upload required documents (listed online) before the decal purchase is completed. Cost is \$20
- Student drivers must possess a valid parking decal to sign-out with parent consent. If students are caught driving recklessly, leaving campus without permission, or have excessive sign-ins they will receive consequences that may include surrendering their parking decal.

NEW! SIGN-IN/SIGN-OUT Procedures Parents and guardians will not permitted to enter the building for sign-ins and sign-outs.

Sign-ins Procedures

- 1) Escort student to the main doors,
- 2) approach ticket booth, to the left of main entrance doors,



- 3) inform the office staff that you are signing student in.
- 4) Student will be let in and parent/guardian is free to leave.

Sign-outs Procedures

- 1) Approach ticket booth, to the left of main entrance doors,
- 2) inform the office staff that you are signing student out and,
- 3) parent's/guardians will be required provide ID to office staff for verification.
- Once verified by office staff, parents/guardians may return to their vehicle to wait for their students to be released.

Student Code of Conduct

District's Policy Manuel

Student Code of Conduct - Welcome - Hillsborough County Public Schools (sdhc.k12.fl.us)

Respect for law and for those persons in authority shall be expected of all students. This respect includes conformity to school rules as well as general provisions of law affecting students. Respect for the rights of others, consideration of their privileges, and cooperative citizenship shall also be expected of all members of the school community.

Respect for real and personal property; pride in one's work; achievement within the range of one's ability, and exemplary personal standards of courtesy, decency, and honesty shall be maintained in the schools of this District.

The Board has zero tolerance for conduct that poses a serious threat to school safety. Zero tolerance policies must apply equally to all students, and are not intended to be rigorously applied to petty acts of misconduct and misdemeanors. This zero tolerance policy does not require the reporting of petty acts of misconduct and misdemeanors to a law enforcement agency, including, but not limited to disorderly conduct, disrupting a school function, simple assault or battery, affray, theft of less than \$300, trespassing, and vandalism of less than \$1,000. The District will seek to use alternatives to expulsion or referral to law enforcement agencies unless the use of such alternatives will pose a threat to school safety.

The District shall enter into agreements with local law enforcement specifying procedures for ensuring that acts that pose a serious threat to school safety, whether committed by a student or adult, are reported to a law enforcement agency.

Students may be subject to discipline for violation of the Code of Student Conduct even if that conduct occurs on property not owned or controlled by the Board but that is connected to activities or incidents that have occurred on property owned or controlled by the Board. Students also may be subject to discipline for conduct that, regardless of where it occurs, is directed at a Board official or employee or the property of such official or employee.

Student conduct shall be governed by the rules and provisions of the Code of Student Conduct. This Code of Student Conduct shall be reviewed annually.

Bus Assignment Letter or Newsletter Notification

Dear Parent:

The safety of students is the number one priority of the Transportation Department. Students living two or more miles from the assigned school and exceptional education students with specialized transportation need to qualify for transportation services according to state statute. Students living within two miles may qualify for transportation due to hazardous walking conditions as defined by the State

Students who are eligible for pupil transportation services are assigned to a specific bus and stop. Students must use the bus stop of record that coincides with their residence and are not authorized to ride other buses. Parent notes authorizing a student to ride a different bus are not accepted. Requests due to a family hardship or emergency situation must be submitted to a school administrator for approval by the principal and the General Director of Transportation or designee.

If a student boards at an unauthorized stop or on an unauthorized bus, the driver will notify a school administrator who will contact the parent. If the student continues unauthorized boarding, a disciplinary referral will be submitted to the school administration.



La solicitud debido a una situación de dificultad familiar o emergencia debe presentarse a un administrador de la escuela para su aprobación por el director y el Director General de Transporte o la persona designada.

Si un estudiante aborda en una parada no autorizada o en un autobús no autorizado, el conductor notificará a un administrador de la escuela que se comunicará con el padre. Si el estudiante continúa internado no autorizado, se enviará una referencia disciplinaria a la administración de la escuela.


