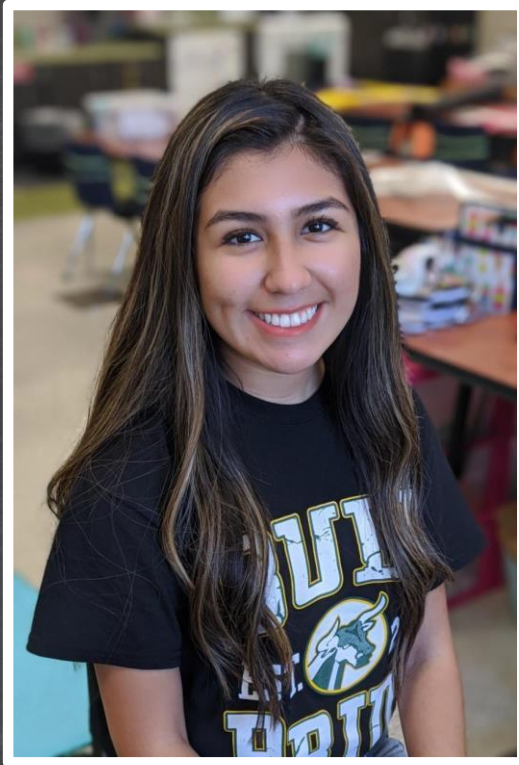

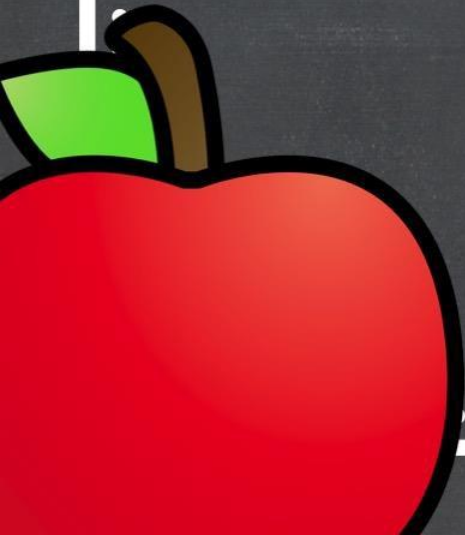

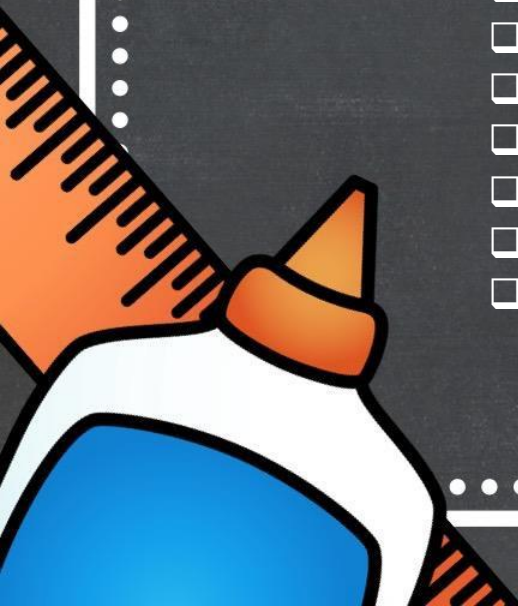

Kindergarten **Supplies**

- 1 blue 3 prong plastic folder
- 4 boxes of crayons (24 count)
- 8 glue sticks
- 1 pair of Fiskar scissors (blunt style)
- 2- 1" clear view white binder with pockets
- Primary composition books with handwriting lines
- 6 black dry erase markers
- 1 pack of index cards
- 1 pack pink erasers
- 1 large bottle of hand sanitizer
- 1 container of Lysol wipes
- 1 box of tissues
- 1 pack of white copy paper
- 1 box of sandwich size Ziploc bags (boys only)
- 1 box of snack size Ziploc bags (girls only)

Expectations

READING:

Children must be able to:

- identify ALL lowercase and uppercase letters in the alphabet.
- pronounce all 21 consonant sounds and all 10 vowel sounds (short and long).
- identify 70% of the 25 sight words for this quarter.
 - Read a Level 1 DRA.



1st Nine Weeks

Expectations

WRITING:

Children must be able to:

- write his or her name correctly.
- draw and label a picture.
- copy environmental print.
- write a word using phonetic spelling.



1st Nine Weeks

Expectations

MATH:

Children must be able to:

- use positional words.
- count, write, and represent numbers 1 through 10.
- compare numbers 1 through 10 using the words more and less.



1st Nine Weeks

Expectations

SCIENCE:

Children will be able to:

- use science tools to observe, measure and investigate.
- identify their five senses and how we use them to explore the world around us.



1st Nine Weeks

Expectations

BEHAVIORS:

Children should be able to:

- follow directions.
- treat others with kindness.
- keep their hands and feet to themselves.
 - use the bathroom without help.
 - tie their shoes (Velcro straps are fine).
 - be respectful to school property.
 - be respectful to teachers.
 - keep masks on at all times.
 - NOT share supplies.



Sight **WORDS**

Sight words are commonly used words that young children are encouraged to memorize. This memorization helps them to automatically recognize these words in print without having to sound them out.

By the end of the year, our Kindergarteners will have been exposed to many sight words. You will receive a master list of all the sight words included in the curriculum this year.

Mastery of ALL sight words taught this year is expected by the end of kindergarten.



Sight words in a text:



"Look at Lola.

She is so clean!"

said Mom.

"And she smells so good,"

said Dad.

Skill **INCENTIVES**

Each nine weeks, students will have an incentive for reaching the goal that is set for that quarter.

For **example**:

Quarter	Skill/Goal	Incentive
1 st	Letter I.D. & Sounds	Popcorn Party
2 nd	Beginning, Middle, & Ending Sounds	Smores Party
3 rd	CVC/CVCe Word Families	Pizza Party
4 th	Sight Words	Ice Cream Sundae Party

What can I do at **HOME?**

After watching their favorite cartoons, ask:

- What do you remember about the show?
- Who were the characters?
- What was the setting?
- What happened at the beginning/middle/end of the show?
- What did the show make you think of?



What can I do at **HOME?**

When cooking together, say:

- Let's count the number of ingredients we used.
- Let's count the number of cookies we made.
- What is the first/last sound in the word cookies, pancakes, cake, etc...?
 - Are there any sight words in the recipe?



What can I do at **HOME?**

At the store, you can:

- look for products on the shelf and say, "Find words that begin with the letter *b*." (use any letter)

- find words that begin with the sound /b/. (use any sound)
- find sight words on the labels. read all the words on the labels.



What can I do at HOME?

In the car, you can:

- count the number of cars you pass.
- count the number of e's you see on signs and cars? (use any letter)
- look for sight words on signs and cars.
