

Celebrating Hispanic Heritage Month



In September, we continued to review and practice the **OWLS** expectations: **O**utstanding students, **W**orking together, **L**ove of learning, **S**elf-control. We will continue to remind students to demonstrate the OWLS expectations throughout the year. Students learned to recognize, report, and refuse bullying. Next month, students in 4th and 5th grades will learn about mental health and take a pledge to ACT NOW!!! Other classes will learn about feelings. Carrollwood's character traits for the month of October are respect/empathy. Students will learn how to apply the golden rule and the importance of respect and empathy. Respect is showing that you care about another's rights and beliefs and acknowledging and accepting their differences. Empathy involves putting oneself in another person's shoes and the ability to understand another person's feelings.

Tips for helping your child with respect and empathy

- 1. Model empathy and respect
- 2. Encourage your child to talk about and name their feelings.
- 3. Any time your child is disrespectful talk to them about how their actions make others feel.
- **4.** Define respect using words and examples.
- 5. Correct disrespectful behaviors when they happen by letting your child know that they are not okay.
- **6.** Teach them to expect respect from others. They can use "1" statements to let others know how they want to be treated.


