

This school year we seem to have more Orange Grove car riders than in previous years. Each day it gets a little bit quicker in the morning and the afternoon. The following steps taken can help us move the line along more efficiently. In the morning: prior to approaching the cones, please have your child put down their electronic device, say their good-byes to you, have book bag and lunchbox in hand so when we open the car door, they are ready to hop out. A Note From Mr. Testoni


The school year has begun, and our instructional priorities are taking shape as we continue to work together as a school community in meeting the ever-evolving needs of our students.

At Carrollwood Elementary School we have continued to build our academic achievements around the practices of implementing standards-based learning experiences and student academic progress monitoring. This year our K-2 students are working with the new K-2 English Language Arts B.E.S.T standards. This is the first year of B.E.S.T. (Benchmark for Excellent Student Thinking). standard implementation in the state. Next year the B.E.S.T. standard implementation will include all grades K-5 and address both Language Arts, as well as Math / Science. To support the implementation of the K-2 ELA standards the district has adopted the Wonders K-2 reading series to support our learners.

The beginning of the year brings with it a whole new set of data points used by all stakeholders (especially our students) to progress monitor academic growth, set academic goals and generate differentiated learning experiences focused on acceleration, throughout the year. The following schedule will be used by K-5 students to complete all beginning of the year assessments.

Welcome back! It has been so exciting to see all students back in person this year. In August, we reviewed and practiced the OWLS expectations: Outstanding students, Working together, Love of learning, Self-control. We will continue to remind students to demonstrate the OWLS expectations throughout the year. In September, I will begin classroom lessons. We will begin the year with lessons on bullying. Students will learn how to "Recognize, Report, and Refuse." Encourage your child to tell a trusted adult if they see bullying, or a bully is targeting them. Parents can report bullying to the teacher, a student services staff member (counselor, social worker, psychologist, resource officer, or school nurse), administration, or via the Hillsborough County School District's website.

This year I will focus on helping students learn about feelings, empathy, and growth mindset. The character trait of the month for September is self-control. Self-control is the ability to control one's actions and reactions.

Tips for helping your children with self-control

- 1. Help them to self-sooth as early as infancy. Be there for them and provide reassurance when they are upset but give them age-appropriate tools they can use to calm down. Some examples are belly breathing, taking a time-out, movement, talking, journaling.
- **2.** Help them name their feelings and allow them to feel those feelings. When they are ready, help them use coping strategies, such as belly breathing or going for a walk to help them calm down.
- 3. Model self-control
- **4.** Practice self-control with do overs. For example, "I understand you were frustrated that you could not see your friend, but I need you to speak to me in a respectful tone. Let's try that again." Praise them when they get it right. Role-plays work great too!
- 5. Focus on the positive and reward them when they exhibit self-control.
