UNIFORM POLICIES AND PROCEDURES



Woodson PK-8 School has adopted a policy providing for a mandatory uniform dress code for all students. The mandatory policy begins on the first day of school each year. This uniform policy has been in effect since August 2005.

SHIRTS: White, navy, grey or maroon/burgundy polo style shirts with a collar to be worn Monday through Thursday. When wearing the school uniform, no logo or writing or logo is allowed. Spirit T-Shirts and denim are only permitted to be worn on Fridays. Torn or bleach spotted denim is not allowed. Biker shorts and leggings are not permitted.

PANTS/ SHORTS/SKIRTS/SKORTS or JUMPERS*: Khaki or Navy Blue *Collared shirts are to be worn under jumpers.

SHOES: Shoes must be securely fastened and have a low heel height. Footwear must be suitable for outdoor physical education classes and unsafe shoes such as "skate tennis shoes" are not allowed.

WINTER WEAR: Students may wear sweatshirts or sweaters – maroon/burgundy, white, or navy blue.

Exemptions and Procedures

A student's parent may apply for his/her child or children to be exempt from the uniform dress code. A form requesting exemption can be picked up in the front office and must be returned to the school principal.

Financial Hardship
