courage parents to buy all the basics/essentials such as paper, pencils, pens, spiral notebooks, glue sticks, colored pencils, binders, etc.



### Maintaining the integrity of the learning environment is our top priority, thus Coleman is a "no phone zone" for 2022-2023 during school hours (9:35 a.m.- 4:30 p.m.).

Students are permitted to have cell phones in their possession throughout the school day. However, cell phone use is only permitted before the first bell (from 9:15-9:30), during lunch, and after the last bell of the day (4:30 p.m. Tuesday-Thursday; 3:30 p.m. on Mondays).

Cell Phones, Headphones, Earbuds, Ear pods, and other personal electronic devices are to be <u>out of</u> <u>sight</u> during instructional time (inside and outside of classrooms; this includes hallways and restrooms). They will NOT be allowed to be out or visible during transitions or in the classroom. The only exception to the above policy is as follows:

Cell phones used for instructional purposes will be permitted, <u>with the teacher's explicit permission and</u> <u>supervision</u>. Otherwise, students will be asked to keep cell phones/devices in teacher-provided "cell phone garages/holders" or out of sight in a backpack, etc. (*Please note: CMS is receiving laptop carts for every classroom. This should minimize the need for cell phone use for instructional purposes.*)

During times of state testing and other student evaluations, teachers may request that students remove their cell phone from their possession reducing the possibility of compromised test security.

**Display** or **use** of Cell Phones, Headphones, Earbuds, Ear pods, and other electronic devices personal electronic devices without permission will result in the following consequences:

1st Offense = Cell phone/device is confiscated. Cell phone/device will be sent to a school office. The infraction will be recorded by office personnel. The student may pick up the device at the end of the school day.

2nd Offense = Cell phone/device is confiscated. Cell phone/device will be sent to a school office. The infraction will be recorded by office personnel. The student may pick up the device at the end of the school day.

3rd Offense = Cell phone/device is confiscated. Cell phone/device will be sent to a school office. The infraction will be recorded by office personnel. **The parent must pick up the device in the school office.** Continued offenses will result in progressive discipline consequences.

Cell Phones and Electronic Devices

During school hours and while on the bus, cell phones and other electronic devices are to be used under the supervision of district staff for educational purposes only.

Students must comply with the directives of school/district staff regarding when and where electronic devices can be used. Devices may only be used in approved areas and students must comply with the directives of school/ district staff regarding when and where electronic devices may be used. Cell phone conversations and video recording during the school day are prohibited unless under the supervision of staff/school personnel.



### Coleman Middle School Lockers/Backpacks 2022-2023

Lockers will not be used in 2022-2023. In an effort to help with backpacks being overly heavy, CMS has put the following supports in place:

No core classes (English Language Arts, Reading, Science, Social Studies) require a textbook be carried daily to/from school. All textbooks are available

online and any workbooks will be kept in class.

### Students are advised to use one of the following binder systems:

- Use one, 3" multi-subject binder for all classes. Teachers will allow students to have a "tab" in a multiple subject binder.
- Use two multi-subject binders, one for AM morning classes and the other for PM afternoon classes

Either of these reduces the number of binders from up to 7 separate binders to 1-2 binders.

Teachers will share class requirements/supplies at Open House and on the first day of school. All teachers are working with families to minimize overweight backpacks while ensuring students have what they need for class.

Our athletic season will begin in August. This is a great time to start filling out the sports application online. All sports packets are completed online at <u>planeths.com</u>. Paper copies are not accepted.

There are <u>3 videos</u> (Concussion in Sports, Sudden Cardiac Arrest, and Heat IIIness) that <u>students must watch each school year</u>. Certificates of completion will show up after each video and certificates must have <u>student's first and last name on them</u>. You can access the videos through the school district's website under the athletics page under student forms. These certificates will need to be uploaded as part of the sports packet.

Below are some of the items that are **<u>frequently denied</u>**:

- 1. Video certificates are not in student's name.
- 2. <u>Mandatory district insurance</u> has not been purchased or receipt of purchase has not been uploaded.
- 3. <u>EL2 sports physical paperwork (3 page document found on district website under athletics page) is not uploaded or the sports physical does not have the physician's clinic stamp and date.</u>

Also, please be sure to **input the correct names** as you fill out the documents. Many times the sports application is in the parent's name because the parent's name was put in a slot designated for the student's name.

Below are the months each sport will *tentatively* start. **Specific tryout dates and practices will be sent out as we approach each sport.** Normal rule of thumb will be that sports packets are due a week and a half before the tryout date.



- \* The Coleman AM/ PM School Enrichment Program provides a safe, supervised place for students before & after school. The Enrichment Program itself is staffed by certified teachers who are available to help your student with homework.
- The hours are 7:30am 9:15am, at which time your student can go to the cafeteria to enjoy a complimentary breakfast, or hang out with friends, until the school day begins.
- ★ Parents must escort their students into the Media Center and sign the attendance log. The entry gate is on Manhattan, closest to Estrella. It is the first door on the left.
- \* Students are not permitted elsewhere prior to 9:15 without permission and/ or confirmation of a supervising teacher or sponsor (ie; SGA, band/ orchestra practice, clubs, etc.).
- \* Students may not be on campus before 7:30 am, as they will not be supervised, which poses a safety concern. If they are dropped off before 7:30, they will be referred to administration and may be removed from the program.

#### Fee-Based Program Enrollment Criteria

For a child to be eligible to enroll in the Fee-Based Enrichment Program, he/she must be:

- 1. Independent in daily self-care needs.
- 2. No danger to him/herself or others.
- Able to actively participate in large group activities with an adult/student ratio of 1 adult to 29 students.
- Able to remain within the program location and under adult supervision without risk of elopement or wandering.

### AM/PM Enrichment Program Fee Agreement

- Payment is to be made by the date listed for the upcoming month and due by the end of the first full week. When payment is OVERDUE, the student may be WITHDRAWN from the program.
- Monies paid are not refundable. Fees must be paid for the entire month, even if your child is absent or only attends occasionally. This ensures an appropriate teacher to student ratio for the safety and well-being of our students.

### Enrollment Information

Payments run through MyPaymentsPlus.com - It's the same system used to add lunch money, order lockers, and pay for fieldtrips at schools in HCPS. It securely allows tracking of expenses for multiple students, at multiple sites. The link is under Events & Activities; click Before & After School Program; click student you wish to enroll; make appropriate selection for BEFORE or AFTER (listed in alpha order). Once selection is made, an info screen appears with program details, click NEXT for Enrollment Form. Once completed, click SAVE and registration will drop into SHOPPING CART. Upon payment, your student is enrolled.

- Parents must sign their student/s out of the Media for security purposes to ensure safety. The entry gate is on Manhattan, closest to Estrella. It is the first door on the left.
- Students are not permitted anywhere on campus, after school, other than the Media Center, except when written permission has been sent from a specific teacher who will assume responsibility for student until such time as the teacher escorts the student back to the Program and makes contact with the Enrichment staff member.
- \* Students cannot be unsupervised, as this poses a safety concern. If they are found to be wandering campus or somewhere other than the Media Center without permission or adult supervision, they will be referred to administration and may be removed from the program. *Email Campus Director <u>kristina.chowning@hcps.net</u> with any questions.*

### **On Campus Policies and Procedures**

- Students should be seated in their first period class when the 9:35 a.m. bell rings. Students not in first period by 9:35 must sign-in through the office. A doctor/dentist note must be presented for an excused sign-in. Please see HCPS Student Handbook for more information (<u>Student Code of Conduct / Overview (hillsboroughschools.org</u>)
- As students will not have lockers, student may use backpacks/bookbags. Rolling backpacks are allowed.
- Due to "Distracted Learning," students will only be able to access their cell phones on campus before school, during their assigned lunch, and after school. Please see 2022-2023 Coleman MS Electronic Use Policy in this newsletter for more details.
