



BMI Letters: BMI letters were sent out to 6th grade students last week. This is just information for parents regarding their child's height and weight ratio. Any questions regarding BMI should be addressed with your child's pediatrician.

Immunizations and School Entry Physical: If your student received a letter from the school clinic regarding missing vaccinations, please attend to it by the date provided on the letter to avoid exclusion. This goes for the school entry physical as well. If your child has been in the district and has moved from different schools, causing their school entry physical to get lost during the transition, the school clinic will be calling and sending home a letter as well as the Mobile Clinic Schedule.


