Student safety is our primary concern. At East Bay High School, we will be taking these steps to ensure your student's safety during the 2024-2025 school year:

- Sanitation and soap checks will occur by our custodial team daily.
- Student drivers cannot sign out, and back in.
- Our new vestibule requires that any guests be buzzed into the building, thus limiting access. Only 3 people are allowed in the vestibule at a time for safety.
- Food deliveries will only be accepted by a person listed on the emergency card, and with proper ID. Deliveries will only be accepted during the student's lunch period. Uber, Door Dash, etc. are not permitted.
- Students who have severe allergic reactions to foods should communicate this with the clinic, who will communicate this information with the Nutrition Staff.

## STUDENT AFFAIRS INFORMATION

### Student Parking

Students who choose to drive to school are responsible for abiding to the following guidelines:

- Hillsborough County Public Schools is not responsible for vehicles that are parked at East Bay High School.
- The campus speed limit is 10 mph.
- Park in designated areas only.
- A 2024-2025 East Bay High School parking tag must be visible. Parking hang tags are \$20.00.
- Parking illegally will result in a citation.
- Loud music or inappropriate behavior of any kind will result in revocation of parking permit.
- Excessive sign-ins and/or sign-outs may result in a loss of parking privileges.
- Leaving campus without permission will result in revocation of driving privileges and/or additional consequences.

### Dual Enrollment and OJT Parking Information

- Dual enrollment and OJT students park in student parking lot.
- Gates to the student parking lot will be locked during school hours.

To purchase a hang tag you MUST have all of the following:

1. Completed application.
2. Vehicle Registration
3. Valid Drivers License
4. Proof of Insurance
5. \$20.00 cash.

### Driving Privileges and Attendance

Schools are required to report students with 15 or more unexcused absences in a 90 day period to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles for the suspension of driving privileges. Any minor who fails to satisfy attendance requirements at school will be ineligible for driving privileges.

## MEDICATION GUIDELINES

In compliance with Florida State law, only prescription medication will be administered at school. Over-the-counter or sample medications must be accompanied by written orders from the physician. Students cannot carry any medication on them. Whenever possible, medication schedules should be arranged so medication is given at home. Emergency medication records must be updated yearly.

If it becomes necessary for your child to take medication at school, please call the school clinic.

### STUDENT HANDBOOK ATTENDANCE POLICY INFORMATION:

- 5 or more absences within a nine-week grading period may require medical documentation to be excused.
- 10 or more absences within a nine-week grading period may require a meeting with the student's grade-level administrator or guidance counselor to identify potential remedies.
- Students who are absent from class but not listed on the absentee bulletin (skipping) shall be reported by the teacher to the Student Affairs Office. A student who skips may face disciplinary actions.

### SIGN-IN PROCEDURES (HCPS Policy 5230)

- Any student arriving to school after the session has begun must report to the Student Affairs Office. A pass shall be issued indicating excused or unexcused tardy or absence. ***For the student to receive an excused sign-in, a parent or guardian must accompany the student to the Student Affairs Office and give an excusable reason.*** More than two sign-in's in a grading period shall require medical or other documentation and/or a parent must be present in order to be considered excused.

### SIGN-OUT PROCEDURES (PRE-APPROVED AND EMERGENCY) (HCPS Policy 5230)

- Once students arrive on campus, they may not leave without permission from the Assistant Principal for Student Affairs. Students who must leave school during school hours must have their parent request this release by phone or in person to the Office of Student Affairs in order to obtain pre-approval. More than four sign-outs in a grading period shall require medical or other documentation and/or a parent must be present in order to be considered excused.
- **Sign outs will not be allowed after 2:00 on Early Release Mondays, 3:00 on Tues—Fri or 2:45 on Pep Rally Days.**

### MAKE-UP WORK:

- A student who has been absent and whose absence is EXCUSED (by the parent notifying Student Affairs) is permitted to make up the work missed, provided that the student makes arrangements with teachers within **three** days of the student's return to school.

## SATURDAY SCHOOL

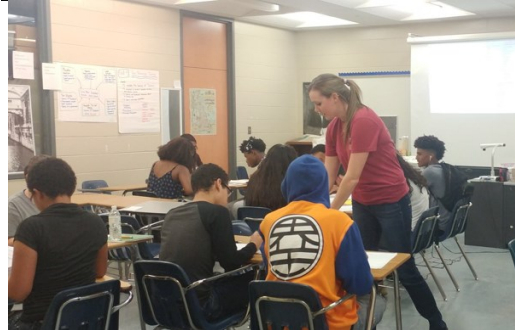
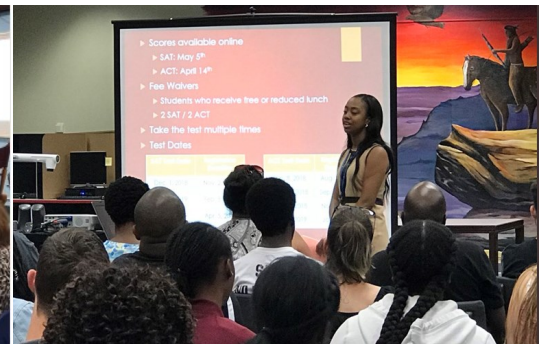

## Cell Phone Policy

When are Cell Phones permitted?

- Students may use their cell phones during breakfast, lunch, and during passing periods. During this time cell phone use **MUST NOT** impede the student's ability to hear the bell, announcements, or directives from teachers/administrators.

When are cell phones NOT permitted?

- Cell phones are not permitted during instructional / class time (Unless permitted by the teacher for instructional purposes). School is not responsible for any loss, theft or damage of electronic devices.

Failure to comply with staff directives may result in the following student consequences:

- First and Second Offense: The device will be confiscated by the staff member, labeled, and given to the administrator. The administrator will notify the parent/guardian and will return the device to the student at the end of the day.
- Third Offense: The device will be confiscated by the staff member, labeled and given to the administrator. A parent or legal guardian must pick up the electronic device.
- Additional Offenses: The device will be confiscated by the staff member, labeled, and given to the administrator. The student may face additional disciplinary consequences.

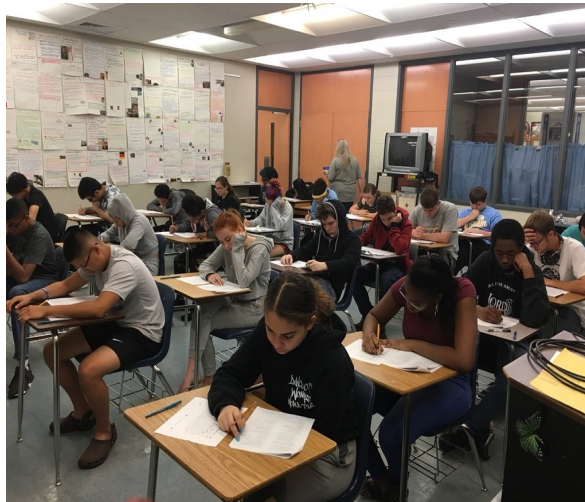
**East Bay is a NO BULLY ZONE**

### **Dress Code**

The dress and grooming of students shall be that which contributes to the health and safety of the individual and which is non-disruptive of the educational activities and processes of a school.

Student garments must meet the approved dress and grooming regulations, cannot disrupt school activities, cannot be obscene or defamatory, and cannot endanger the physical health or safety of themselves or others.

Students have the responsibility to dress and groom in such a manner so as to reflect cleanliness, modesty, safety and good taste. They should also become familiar with, and adhere to, the approved dress and grooming regulations of the School Board of Hillsborough County.



### **Tardiness**

A student should make every effort to be in class on time. An unexcused tardy exists when a student is not in his/her seat or station when the tardy bell rings. Excessive unexcused tardies shall be considered willful disobedience and will be subject to disciplinary action.

### **Emergency Cards**

Emergency Cards (SER) Emergency cards will be sent home with all students on the first day of school. It is the parent's responsibility to carefully check the information, make sure all information is complete, and sign the card. This card needs to be returned to the school promptly. Students must have an updated emergency card on file in order to sign out of school. Only persons listed on the emergency card may sign out a student. Parents are reminded to have a picture ID when signing out a student.

## **What You Should Know About Senior High Athletic Eligibility**

### **Academic Requirements**

If you are in the 11<sup>th</sup> grade or 12<sup>th</sup> grade, you must have a cumulative 2.0 grade point average on a 4.0 unweighted scale in all courses taken through the end of the previous semester. If you are in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade or 10<sup>th</sup> grade, you must have a cumulative 2.0 grade point average on a 4.0 unweighted scale in all courses taken through the end of the previous semester; OR you must have earned a 2.0 grade point average on a 4.0 unweighted scale in the courses taken in the previous semester alone, provided you sign an academic performance contract (FHSAA form EL5) with your school and attend summer school as necessary. (Article 9.4, FHSAA Handbook, Bylaws and Policies)

### **Ninth Grader Eligibility**

A student shall be eligible during the first semester of his/her ninth-grade year provided that it is the student's first entry into the ninth grade and he/she was regularly promoted from the eighth grade the immediately preceding year.

### **Residence**

A student will be eligible at the first school in which he/she enrolls, or participates in an athletic practice, at the beginning of each school year. The student will be eligible in his/her first school of choice each year as long as the student remains enrolled in that school (Florida Law 97-53). Additionally, home school students who are registered through Hillsborough County Public Schools and charter school students who are enrolled in a Hillsborough County registered charter school are eligible for athletic participation at their school of residence.

### **Transfers**

Per School Board Policy 2431.01, student-athletes who transfer are allowed to immediately participate in interscholastic athletics for their new school as long as they are enrolled prior to the start of a specific sport's season. Student-athletes that participate in a sport at their previous school during the same school year may not participate in the same sport unless they meet one of the following criteria:

- A) Dependent children of active duty military personnel whose move resulted from military orders.
- B) Children who have been relocated due to a foster care placement in a different school zone.
- C) Children who move due to a court-ordered change in custody due to separation or divorce, or the serious illness or death of a custodial parent.
- D) Authorized good cause established in this policy.

### **Age**

Students reaching the age of 19 before July 1<sup>st</sup> will be ineligible to participate in interscholastic athletics for that school year and beyond.

### **Limit of Eligibility**

A student shall be eligible for no more than four (4) consecutive academic years upon first entrance to ninth grade as defined by the pupil progression plan of the school in which the student is enrolled. A student who does not attend school, repeats any grade, is declared ineligible to participate, or otherwise fails to exercise the opportunity to participate for any reason for any length of time during this four-year period shall not be entitled to any additional period of eligibility.
