**\*\*Prepare Now for Basketball Season. Tryouts will begin in August\*\***

Tryouts and practices are open to all students who meet the following requirements:

- 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade students must have a 2.0 or higher GPA from the previous semester.
- 6<sup>th</sup> grade students are exempt from this requirement for the **first semester only**.
- Students must maintain passing citizenship grads through weekly eligibility forms.
- Three videos, Concussion in Sports, Sudden Cardiac Arrest and Heat Illness Prevention are now REQUIRED videos for ALL students athletes and must be reviewed each year.
- All students/parents must have completed all parts of the athletic packet online at <https://www.planeths.com>
- Completed application for Athletic Participation
  - Forms can be found at <https://www.hillsboroughschools.org/athleticforms>
  - Completed physical examination (Form EL 2) Physical must be on the EL 2 Form. Printed and taken to physician then scanned back into <https://www.planeths.com>
  - Proof of Purchase of Mandatory Insurance Coverage. Cost is \$25.00. Pay online at [www.schoolinsuranceofflorida.com](http://www.schoolinsuranceofflorida.com) or money order (NO CASH or PERSONAL CHECKS). This is nonrefundable & required to participate in any extramural tryouts and athletics. Once purchased, it covers participation for that entire school year.
  - Certificates from three required videos
  - Medical Release forms
  - Consent & Release from Liability (Form EL 3)

Forms need to be completed only once for the school year to qualify for all sports.

**Tryouts are scheduled after school and open to all athletes that have completed athletic packets on planeths.com. They are publicized through mass emails and announcements.**

Farnell plays games against other area middle schools in our cluster: Davidsen, Hill, Martinez, Smith, and Walker. Seasons consist of weekly games against each of the above teams (5 games) except Track and Field which consists of a Cluster Meet against all the above teams, and a County Championship for qualifiers. Start time for games is 5:30 on Mondays or 6:00 on Tuesdays thru Fridays. Girls play first followed by Boys. Parents are responsible for transportation to and from game sites.

### Student Sign Out Policy

Student Attendance to all classes is important. In the event you need to sign out early, student sign out will end at 3:00 p.m. on Mondays and 4:00 p.m. on Tuesdays-Fridays to ensure a safe and orderly dismissal. Loss of instructional time impacts student achievement so please refrain from signing out your student early.

TOPS – Students may wear:

- Red or Black polo WITH or WITHOUT the Farnell logo

- Red, Black or Gray sweatshirts preferred, not required
- School Spirit or Club shirts on Fridays ONLY

BOTTOMS – Students may wear:

- Leggings – shirt must be fingertip length over leggings, no holes or tears

Hello Falcon Family! This is your friendly neighborhood Deputy here, fighting traffic one car at a time.

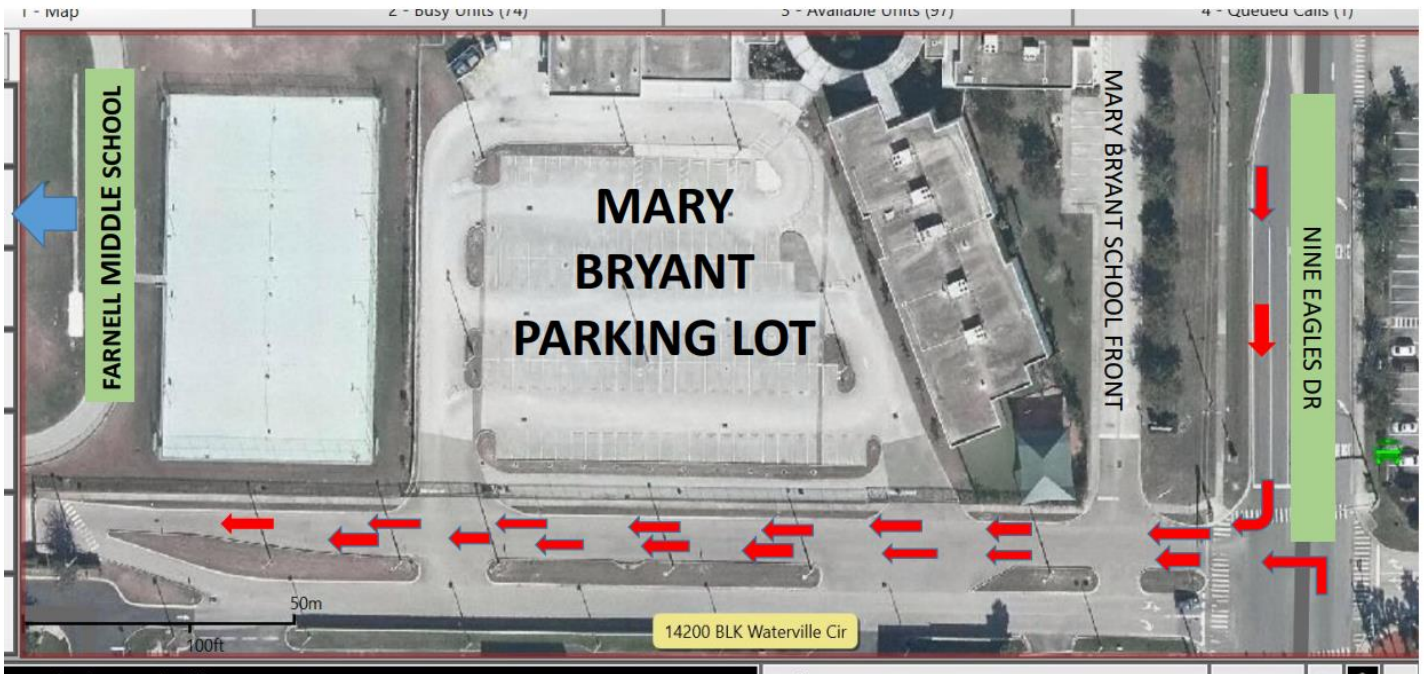
As you all know, traffic can be a maze and sometimes frustrating getting onto our campus. I want you all to understand that this is of no fault of our own. Unfortunately, someone made the executive decision to put two schools on a lot of land that really should be designated for one. To add to the issue, they are both schools where the students require transportation to be picked up. If this was a small high school, it may be more manageable as students would be able to drive themselves home. However, that is not the case. We are limited to the one road that we have, to allow parents access to both schools, so we need to work together to keep traffic moving as efficiently as possible.

If you were wondering why we don't use the parking lot in the morning, this is because the gates to the school have to be closed once school is in session because it offers direct access to their campus. Our school has a fully gated perimeter which is why we can afford to leave the main gate open throughout the day.

That being said, I have attached a lengthy guideline with pictures to help alleviate some of the stresses caused by our traffic. When you have time, please review and read the presentation in its entirety. For those of you who are new to Farnell, WELCOME and thank you for your time.

# Farnell Morning Traffic

- Please review the picture above as you read the instructions for **morning traffic**. This system is as efficient as I can possibly make it considering the two schools and the limited space we have, so bear with me.
- Above you will see red arrows going in the direction of Farnell Middle School, passing Mary Bryant Elementary. These arrows represent your cars traveling towards Farnell. Please try to maintain the integrity of the lanes of traffic as you come down the "Driveway" as we call it. If you maintain your lane, I promise I will get you onto school grounds as soon as possible.
- **\*\*\*BEFORE 9:00am DO NOT BLOCK THE BUS LANE\*\*\*** Traffic will not be moving until your Falcons are clear to enter the school. Please stay in the lane closest to Mary Bryant Elementary, as buses will be pulling in before you get a chance to drop off your kiddo. If your vehicle is not able to pass the gate coming onto school property, please stop at the stop bar so buses can get around you.
- As you see, there are two lanes of traffic in the picture. That means that I would like for you mommy and daddy falcons to come all the way down both lanes after 9:00am, so that we may accommodate more parents as they enter the "Driveway". We will not be stopping at the stop bar after 9:00am. I will be controlling traffic so continue forward. You all know that traffic is impossible and it is already difficult to get off of Racetrack Rd or Nine Eagles as it is. That being said, please pay attention to the traffic movement and come as far forward as possible.
- After 9:00am, Please refrain from shifting from the right lane to the left lane and back to the left lane. I don't think we realize how badly this effects traffic. Please be honest and fair to the other parents waiting in line. Pick a lane and commit to it. I will allow you to merge or merge you myself and get you in on time if you let me. I promise (as long as you show up on time).
- **\*\*\*BUSES TAKE PRIORITY\*\*\*** The children on the buses account for half of our student body, so for every one child you bring, the bus is carrying 60 to 80 of them at a time. I understand that you may have been waiting a little longer than the drivers in the bus lane but I have to allow the buses to pass. Once the buses pass, I will alternate lanes into Farnell.
- **\*\*\*DO NOT BLOCK MARY BRYANT EXIT\*\*\*** Please treat this little cut out exit as a lane of traffic. We can not block any exits of travel.
- **\*\*\*LOOK FOR THE GUY IN THE WHITE SHIRT AND THE GUNBELT\*\*\*** If you get stuck trying to merge or forget that you can come all the way down, look for me at the end of the lane. I am probably waving at you to get your attention.

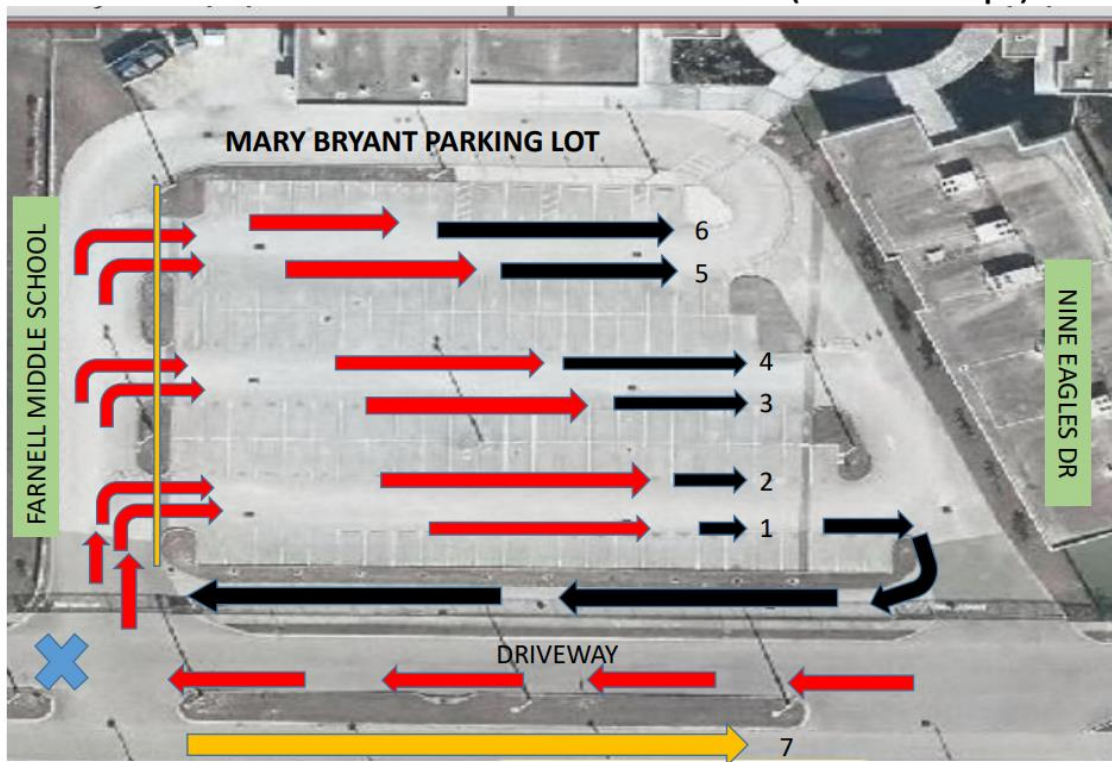

# Farnell Afternoon Traffic (Pick-up)

- Please review the above picture for **afternoon traffic**.
- Above you will see black arrows. That is the car line consisting of parents that have been waiting for their Falcons since 3:30pm and sometimes sooner. These arrows are black because they will most likely be stationary before dismissal.
- If you are not parked in the area where the large black arrows are, you need to move into the bus lane so I can park you into the over flow parking lot inside Mary Bryant Elementary parking lot.
- If you are driving south from Nine eagles you may either stay in the turn lane (black arrow) or go around to the bus lane for overflow parking in the parking lot.
- If you are coming from Racetrack Rd trying to turn left onto the "Driveway", you **CAN NOT** stay on Racetrack Rd, block the roadway for a merge or block the crosswalk. Drive down the bus lane for overflow traffic if you can not merge freely onto the car lane.
- The two blue large arrows show that you all will be turning onto the "Driveway". These blue arrows are off limits for parking. That means you need to be able to clear the roadway before attempting to get onto the "Driveway". Please don't contribute to the dangers of driving in school zones. There are students crossing so be mindful of the Crossing guard or Deputy manning the crosswalk.
- **DO NOT** encroach or attempt to come onto the "Driveway" if there is a Deputy or a Crossing guard in the crosswalk escorting children. Remain stationary.
- Once you make it safely onto the "Driveway", drive down to me (Dep. De la Cruz) so we can get you into overflow parking.

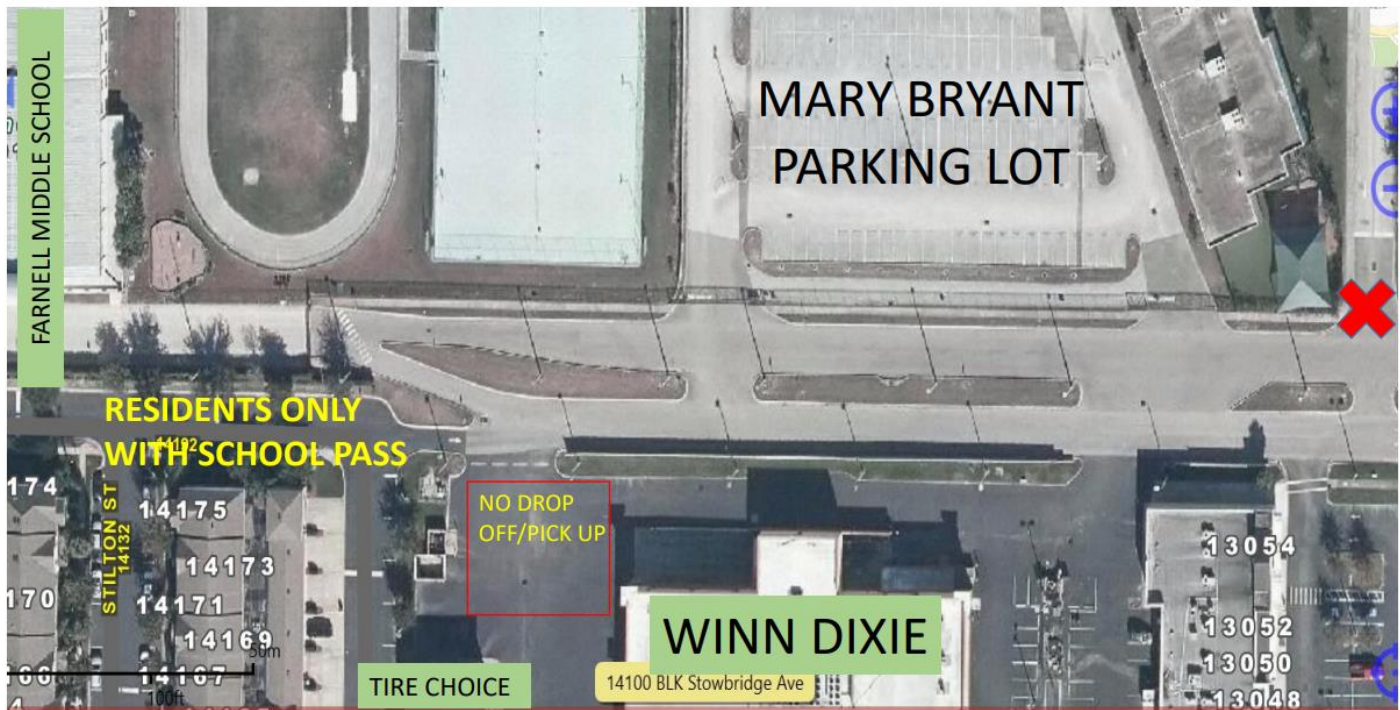




# Farnell Afternoon Traffic (Pick-Up)

- In the above picture you will see how our overflow should work in the afternoons. The red arrows are showing the direction and vehicles that are moving into each line. The black arrows show the start of overflow traffic, starting with the line that sits against the fence, facing Farnell Middle School. You will also see black arrows with a number next to it. That is the start of each lane of overflow traffic. The orange arrow on the opposite side of traffic is our very last lane of overflow. If we get here that means it's either because of bad weather or there are entirely too many mom and dad Falcons picking up their little Falcons. Lol If I send you to #7 then that means I have no options. The orange bar inside the parking lot is the end limit to each lane. Do not congest the area past this point unless we have directed you to.
- As discussed earlier, PLEASE remain in your lane when you are placed or drive there (Lane 1,2,3,4,5,6). Merging into another lane ruins the entire process and complicates traffic patterns. The more we follow this order the faster we can get everyone home. So if you are in lane 3 and you see lane 2 moving, stay in lane 3. We have to think for all of us. We are all one team. Merging makes it impossible to manage as you have already seen the chaos that our traffic issues can bring.
- There should be an administrator or myself leading you to which lane to wait in. If there is no one waving you down and you see no one other than myself, please help me and all of us be successful and move as far forward as you can, into the first lane that you see open.
- The lanes are numbered so that you can see there should be **2 LANES** for each opening in the parking lot. That means no one should be driving down the center of the open area in the parking lot. Move as far right or as far left as you can depending on your lane (Lanes 1,3,5 should be to the very right of the opening. Lanes 2,4,6 should be to the very left of the opening of the lane). Do not drive over the parking spaces with white lines.
- Please remember, there is no possible way for us to account for who got on the "Driveway" first, if you are not in that initial, main parked line of parents. Be patient and understand that there are only 1 to 2 people controlling all of traffic depending on what staff is available.
- Thank you for being patient and making this process easier for everyone. We are aware of the restrictions that we have and we have adjusted where we were able to. I need all of us to follow these instructions for the benefit of us all.

# OVERALL TRAFFIC CONCERNS

- In the above picture you will see a red X, a red square and text highlighted in yellow.
- I have had several questions regarding these other spaces that appear to be available so I am addressing them here.
- Looking at the picture, you will see “Residents only with school pass” written in yellow. This area is only available to students who have a school pass to cross the teacher occupied crosswalk. As you can imagine we have had parents park within that community to drop their little falcons off. This causes a severe congestion within the community and frustration/ concern for the residents of that community. The reason the school administration enforces this rule is because the community has voiced their frustration with the traffic caused by the school. That being said, the school asks that you do not drop off at that area unless your child has a school pass. Do the right thing, we are all adults.
- Next, you will see a red square with yellow text of “ NO DROP OFF/ PICK UP”. This area is also off limits to the general population, specifically our Falcon family. The businesses within the plaza are asking the school to enforce appropriate traffic patterns and not let passing in this large open area. This area is where the Plaza takes delivery, and Tire Choice conducts it’s business. This is a sincere complaint by the businesses as it interferes with their daily operation and use of the area. Please do not use this area to drop off or pick up your falcon. I would rather keep all contact with all of you awesome people as positive experiences and avoid any unnecessary confrontation by the school or its administration.
- To the very right of the picture there is a large red X. That simply is showing that exit from Mary Bryant can not be blocked. The buses and all traffic leaving Mary Bryant has to have access to the exit. Consider this a lane of travel.
- Last, As your Falcon Family is leaving campus be cautious of cross, walking traffic. There are times where we will have falcons not follow the rules and cross our traffic lanes without looking. The same applies once we approach the intersection of Nine Eagles. Do not enter the intersection if there is a Crossing guard or Deputy directing the children across the crosswalk. Your car should be stationary, waiting for the Deputy or Crossing guard to clear the crosswalk before you start to turn left or right depending on which crosswalk the crossing person is occupying. Once the Crossing guard or Deputy is clear of the cross walk you are free to turn. Thank you all for your patience and lets all be safe and make the best of our one lane road they gave us for both schools!
- Caveat: We have had issues with parents not being able to get to Farnell due to Mary Bryant’s car line. I will not fault you if you have to take alternate routes or measures to get to Farnell. I only ask that you approach whatever roadway you use safely and you do not go over any medians. No playing chicken with on coming traffic. Thank you all for your time. GO FALCONS!!

## No Drop Off Policy

In an effort to respect and maximize instructional time, we WILL NOT receive any non-medical items or call classrooms for deliveries at any time during the school day. Students are not allowed to order or have delivered outside food from local restaurants. Lunch from the cafeteria or lunch from home are allowed on school property.

## Electronic Scooters

Students are discouraged from bringing electronic scooters on campus. We do not have covered parking for electronic scooters. If a student rides an electronic scooter to school, the scooter must be parked in the uncovered bike rack. The school is not responsible for any damage to the electronic scooter. Electronic Scooters. Bikes and Skateboards must be walked off campus. Students must wear a helmet and have a signed permission slip at Farnell. Please see permissions slip form in the first day packet.

## Helmets Required by Law

In accordance with Florida Statute 316.2065(d), A bicycle rider or passenger who is under 16 years of age must wear a bicycle helmet that is properly fitted and is fastened securely upon the passenger’s head by a strap and that meets the federal safety standard for bicycle helmets.

## Bus Transportation

If your student lives farther than 2 miles from the school, bus transportation will be provided by the school district. Bus passes will be printed on the first day of school. Please check the district website for eligibility, bus routes and any other information. Transportation is a privilege and students who violate the code of conduct may lose their transportation privileges.

### Creating a Canvas Parent Account

**Note: If you have already created a mySPOT account, you do not need to complete this process**

To create a Canvas Parent Account, you must register through the district mySPOT portal. The email and password created through a mySPOT account will be used to log in to your Parent Canvas account.

<p>1. Access the district website at <b>www.hillsboroughschools.org</b> and then click the <b>Canvas Log In</b> icon in bottom left.</p> <p>Then on the Hillsborough Schools Digital Classroom page, click <b>Register</b> under the <b>Canvas for HCPS Parents</b> tile.</p>	
<p>2. On the <b>mySPOT</b> page, fill out all of the fields: email address, student number, select school, birth month, birth day, birth year, last four of student social security number, and relationship to student. Check the box to declare information is true and correct. Select <b>Register</b>.</p> <p>A <b>confirmation email</b> will be sent to complete the registration and create a password for your MySPOT account.</p> <p>Note: Additional students can be added in mySPOT after registration is complete.</p>

After registering at mySPOT, your account will not be active in Canvas until the next day.</p> <p>With your active mySPOT account, access the district website at <b>www.hillsboroughschools.org</b></p> <p>Click <b>Canvas Log In</b> icon in bottom left of the website. Then click <b>Log In</b> under the <b>Canvas for HCPS Parents</b> tile on the right side.</p>

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# every day MATTERS

**Teaching and Learning Begins Monday, August 12**

Every day matters when it comes to attendance! There is a strong link between regular attendance and academic success. Research indicates that missing 10% of the school year, which is 2 days a month, negatively affects a student's academic performance.

Compared to students who are chronically absent, students who attend school regularly have greater success in all grade levels.

**Elementary school** students who regularly attend class are 1.7 times more likely to achieve grade-level scores in English Language Arts and 2 times more likely to achieve grade-level scores in Math.

> **Chronic absenteeism** leads to students struggling to read proficiently.

**Middle school** students who attend school on a regular basis are 2 times more likely to score on grade level in English Language Arts and Math.

> **Absenteeism in sixth grade** leads to students facing difficulties with their coursework.

**High school** students who are consistently in class are 1.7 times more likely to score on grade level in English Language Arts and 2 times more likely to score on grade level in Math.

> **Chronic absenteeism** for high school students leads to them being off-track for on-time graduation.

If your student is facing any obstacles that affect their attendance, our schools and counselors are here to help. Please reach out to your school for assistance. ## **Synergy**

At the start of the new school year, Synergy's ParentVUE will replace MySpot as the HCPS parent application. Parents and guardians will need to create their ParentVUE accounts to view student information like reports cards, attendance, and graduation status. Parents and guardians will continue to use Canvas to view current class grades, assignments, and for communication with teachers. Parents/Guardians will receive an individual parent activation code letter during the first few weeks of school. We are not allowed to email parent activation letters to families. If the letter is misplaced, please stop by the main office for a printed copy.

## **Student Nutrition**

All Hillsborough County Public Schools students can receive free breakfast each morning. Secondary school lunch is \$2.75. A la carte items are available as well. Free school meals for students has ended. Families can apply for free/reduced price lunch online at [MySchoolApps - Getting Started](#) on the district website. Lunch payment accounts can be set up at My Payments Plus on the district website.
