## Health Safety Protocols For when we return to the school building

#### Arrival:

- Additional entryway for walkers only
- No holding areas in the morning. Students will get breakfast, if they choose to, and eat socially distanced in designated areas. Students will then go directly to homeroom.
- Safe distancing visuals posted in cafeteria as students wait for breakfast
- Additional staff assigned to monitor arrival

#### Passing Time:

- Hallways will have a center line as visual for students to walk to the right side of the hallway
- Stairwells will be direction specific (up or down, not both)
- Staggered dismissal times for each period (6<sup>th</sup> grade will pass alone; 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade will pass together)
- Additional staff in hallways during passing times

#### Lunch:

- Additional areas for students to eat
- Limited number of students per table
- Students will find their seat upon arrival and be called up by table to get their lunch
- Additional serving window in cafeteria
- No court time after lunch
- Dismissed by table
- Additional staff assigned to monitor lunch

#### <u>Dismissal:</u>

- Buses will be dismissed one at a time
- Walkers will be dismissed by grade level and will use the same gate used during arrival
- Students waiting for car pick up will be split into smaller groups
- Additional staff assigned to monitor dismissal


#### Additional Safety Measures:

- Face coverings will be required and enforced when social distancing cannot be achieved
- Teachers will be allowed/encouraged to hold class outside whenever feasible
- Additional hand sanitizing stations installed throughout campus

### Morning Arrival

- Morning Arrival Procedures
- Walkers enter campus through gate on Delaware.
- Cars enter Edison for carline. Wait until drop off point near gym to exit vehicle
- Bus riders will be dropped off in front of school. Wait until adult signal to exit bus
- <u>Campus opens at 9:15 a.m. for</u> <u>students.</u>
- Once on campus, students can go to get breakfast on the patio or cafeteria or go straight to homeroom.
- For safety reasons, no students should be dropped off at the Swann Ave Market or any area other than assigned drop off spots.





# Algebra and Geometry Overview 2020-21

#### Course Summary

Algebra and Geometry both earn high school credit for the students and culminate the year with a statemandated End of Course exam. Students can expect a manageable workload of approximately 3-4 nights of homework per week, weekly quizzes, and bi-weekly tests.

Course progress will be continually updated for each student within Canvas.

#### Grading Scale

- 50%- Tests
- 30%- Quizzes
- 20% Homework/Classwork

#### • Materials

- Spiral notebook dedicated for class notes, folder for graded assignments, scientific calculator, pencil, and graph paper. Consumable workbooks will be sent home with all students to use as a resource. Textbooks are available online through Canvas. Students who wish to have a hard cover textbook at home can do so.

# WHAT IS FOUNDATIONS OF ROBOTICS?

- Foundations of robotics is a high school level course that will be applied to the students high school GPA.
- Students will study the principles and applications of robotic engineering and its effect upon our lives and the choosing of an occupation.
- Content and activities are designed to study entrepreneurship, safety, and leadership skills with a focus on the engineering process.
- The program focuses on transferable skills and stresses understanding and demonstration of science, mathematics, technological tools, machines, materials, and systems related to robotics.
- All work will be presented and submitted for the course through Canvas.

#### **ROBOTICS LABS AND COURSEWORK**

- Classroom time will be spent learning about the history of robots, robotic functions, programming, and impacts of robotics on society.
- The lab time will feature engineering challenges where students will be designing and building robots to carry out specific tasks or functions.
- Due to Covid-19, the majority of the coursework will be presented in a digital format, including lab activities. We will return to hands on robotics when it is deemed safe for students to share equipment in the classroom.
