TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

School Buses

Woodrow Wilson Middle School has buses that provide transportation to and from school each day. The bus routes, which include stops and times are available from the school District website, www.sdhc.k12.fl.us. At the time this letter was printed, the 20-21 bus schedules have not been posted. The 19-20 bus schedules can still be accessed on the Wilson website and the stops typically do not change too much. Bus riders enter campus through the side, west gate.

Walking/Biking

Walking and bike riding is encouraged whenever possible. If you live south of the school, students cross Swann Avenue at the crosswalk in front of the school. Our bike racks are located on the west side of the school. Students are reminded to lock their bikes daily. Don't forget, helmets are required. Students walking or riding their bikes to/from school are expected to go directly to their destination. **Loitering in the neighborhood or at the deli at the corner of Swann and Delaware is not permitted.** Walkers and bike riders enter the campus through the side, west gate.

Car Riders

Parents bringing/picking up their child by car may drop off beginning at 9:00am and may enter the car line at 4:00pm. Cars enter Edison Avenue from DeLeon Street. Cars unload/load five at a time. Students enter campus through the side, east gate on Edison Avenue. **Any students remaining at 4:30pm will be taken to our aftercare program in the cafeteria. A supervision fee will be incurred.**

BACK TO SCHOOL CLOTHES SHOPPING

When purchasing clothing, please ensure that it follows the dress code for Hillsborough County Public Schools:

The dress and grooming of students shall be that which contributes to the health and safety of the individual and which is non-disruptive of the educational activities and processes of a school. The definition of appropriate dress shall vary with the age of the student, the program of instruction, and the heating/cooling system of the building.

Students have the right: to dress as they choose as long as their dress meets the approved dress and grooming regulations, does not disrupt school activities, is not obscene or defamatory, and does not endanger the physical health or safety of themselves or others.

Students have the responsibility: to dress and groom in such a manner so as to reflect cleanliness, modesty, safety and good taste; become familiar with and adhere to approved dress and grooming regulations of the School Board of Hillsborough County.

- Shoes shall be worn. Skate tennis shoes and bedroom slippers are unacceptable and not allowed.
- Clothing that exposes the entire shoulder, tube tops, spaghetti straps, or similar type of clothing may only be worn with a blouse or shirt. Clothing exposing the torso or the midriff, either front, back, or sides shall not be worn. Underwear shall not be visible. Clothing shall not expose the mid-chest area. Clothing not properly fastened or with tears that are indecent shall not be worn. Clothing traditionally designed as undergarments or sleepwear shall not be worn as outer garments. All pants and shorts shall be secured at the waist. Boys' shirts shall have sleeves. Mini-skirts, mini-dresses, and short shorts shall not be permitted. Hemlines shall be no shorter than fingertip length.
- Hair shall be clean and neatly groomed. Head coverings shall not be worn in the building unless required for religious observance or health-related reasons.
- Garments and/or jewelry that display or suggest sexual, vulgar, drug, gang, weapons, or alcohol-related wording or graphics, or that provoke or may tend to provoke violence or disruption in the school, shall not be worn. Wallet chains shall not be worn.

Parent Visitation

Due to our limited space, we cannot accommodate parents/visitors visiting their child for lunch. We support your involvement with school but not during the lunch period.

Additionally, although a child's birthday is something to honor, middle schools do not celebrate birthdays at school. No balloons, cakes or other such gifts will be given to students during the school day.

Photo ID Required

For the safety of our students, all visitors are required to show photo id and sign in at our attendance office. A Visitor Pass will be issued. Parents are required to make an appointment in advance to speak/conference with a teacher.

If it becomes necessary to sign your child out of school prior to dismissal, an adult must come to the attendance office prior to 4:00pm. **PHOTO I.D. IS REQUIRED FOR ALL ADULTS SIGNING A CHILD OUT OF SCHOOL.** Only adults listed on the student emergency card will be permitted to sign a student out of school.

7th Grade NJHS

Each year, the National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) inducts new members from among the 7th grade class. **To be eligible for NJHS membership, candidates must have maintained a 3.75 academic average for the first three quarters of their 7th grade year. Students must also have no discipline events that result in a suspension.**

Dear Parents and Guardians of Students; Faculty and Staff:

The Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) is a state agency that oversees the cleanup of sites throughout Florida. The FDEP is responsible for notifying School Boards throughout the state when any contamination is discovered at school property. School Boards which receive such notice are further required to notify all Faculty, staff, parents, and guardians of students attending the school.

In 2009/2010 school year, the FDEP notified the Hillsborough County School Board regarding the identification of soil and/or groundwater contamination at several school locations. This letter is to fill the annual requirement of notification for the identified locations. In addition, the School Board also decided to voluntarily expand their notification process beyond FDEP requirements to include other school locations based upon a review of available information regarding historical as well as more recent soil and groundwater testing results.

DUE TO THE LOW POTENTIAL FOR EXPOSURE, THE SOIL AND/OR GROUNDWATER CONSTITUENT CONCENTRATIONS IDENTIFIED AT THESE LOCATIONS DO NOT POSE A SIGNIFICANT HEALTH RISK. THE SCHOOLS ARE SAFE FOR STUDENTS, PARENTS, STAFF AND VISITORS.

Given health concerns created by Covid-19, Woodrow Wilson Middle School made the difficult decision not to hold the Woodrow Wilson Foundation Back-to-School Bash, Dance-a-thon, or PTSA Fall Festival during Fall 2020, **making our Business Partners and Families more important than ever.**

Please consider partnering with the Woodrow Wilson Foundation and PTSA to help ensure the continued success of our students. The Foundation and PTSA provide crucial school resources not available through state and local funding.
