## Students and Cell Phones

Cell phones have created unnecessary disruptions on campus. Our school policy is that cell phones must be turned off and in bookbags. No cell phone usage is permitted on campus. If a student violates this policy, a parent will be contacted to pick up the phone from school. The child will not be permitted to bring a phone on campus for the remainder of the school year. Please read the tips below if your child has access to a cell phone.

Hillsborough Student Code of Conduct: Students must comply with the directives of school/district staff regarding when and where electronic devices can be used. [Excerpt p.48]



## Parenting Tips for Minors with Phones



#### 1. Phones Belong to Parents, not Students.

Kids are minors and they are only given access to cell phones if an adult provides one to them. Parents should have full access to phones at any time, including all passcodes for the device. Parents are encouraged to frequently read messages and content on a minor's phone.

#### 2. Expectations for Phone Behavior

Children are expected to behave as well on the phone as they do in person. They should understand that there is no difference between a child using profanity or making inappropriate comments via cell than in-person. Cell phone conversations should be monitored by parents to ensure these expectations are upheld.

#### 3. Establish Times/Places of Cell Usage

There is etiquette to using cell phones. Teach children at an early age when and where it's appropriate to be on the cell phone. There should be a set time each evening when cell phones are to be discontinued.

#### 4. Digital Footprint

Talk to your children about digital footprints A digital footprint is all the information that is sent, viewed, posted, and received. All images and texts can be recovered—even if it was deleted. Sending an inappropriate image or text can be shared by others without knowledge. This can lead to embarrassment and discipline.

#### 5. Parental Controls

Consider using apps that monitor and provide parents with access to their children's cell phone usage. Providing a child with a cell phone gives a minor wide-open access to platforms and content that can be inappropriate for their ages. Using parental controls can help prevent children from accessing such content.


