How can I help my child?

- **Make sure your child is present and on time each testing day. Your child may not enter class once testing has started if they are tardy.**
- **Schedule any doctor appointments on a different day. We will be unable to interrupt a test that is already in session to call a student out.**
- Send your child to school prepared (glasses, sweater, water bottle, etc.).
- Rearrange after school and evening activities during testing windows.
- Ensure that your child receives a good night sleep every night during testing.
- Ensure that your child has a nutritious breakfast on test days. As usual, breakfast will be provided for free at school.
- Please remember students are not permitted to have notes, scratch paper, or any electronic devices (tablets, cell phones, electronic games, smart watches, etc.) in their possession during test administration.
- Express your support and confidence that your child will do well on any testing.
- Help your child understand that testing is part of the instructional process and is not something to fear.
