Student Information and Procedures

What are the school hours?

9:35a.m. – 4:30p.m.

What time can car-riders/walkers/bike-riders arrive on campus?

- Students may begin arriving on campus at 9:15a.m. However, students who arrive on campus between 9:15a.m. will stay in the holding area.

Where do bus riders go between 9:15 a.m. and 9:30 a.m.?

- Students have two options: First, they may go to the cafeteria for breakfast. Second, they may report to designated holding areas until the 9:30a.m. bell.

Is there a before-school care fee-based program?

The district will allow Liberty Middle School to have a before-school fee-based program provided the enrollment averages at least 15 students per day. There is a \$30 one-time registration fee.

- The before-school fee-based program will begin at 7:00a.m. Monday through Friday.
- The weekly charge for this service is \$20.00. **This charge is for all students.**
- An application for this program is on-line at <https://hostportal.sdhc.k12.fl.us/> **Parents are required to walk their students to the before-school care room and sign-in their child on a daily basis.**

Is there an after-school fee-based program?

The district will allow Liberty Middle School to have an after-school fee-based program provided the enrollment averages at least 15 students per day. There is a \$30 one-time registration fee.

- The after-school fee-based program will provide after-school care Monday through Friday from 4:30 – 6:00 p.m.
- The weekly charge for this service is \$32.00. **This charge is for all students.**
- An application for this program is on-line at <https://hostportal.sdhc.k12.fl.us/>
- Parents are required to sign-out their child every day with after-school personnel.
- before and after school, the weekly fee is \$52.00

Can parents drop off students before 9:15a.m. if they are NOT enrolled in the before-school fee-based program?

NO -- Students cannot be dropped off before 9:15a.m. unless they are enrolled in the before-school care fee-based program.

How late can parents pick up children after school?

All afternoon car-riders need to be picked up in front of the school by 4:40 p.m. (or until the pick-up line clears). Students who are left on the “car ramp” after the pick-up line clears, will be required to contact their parents. Students who have a pattern of being picked up late will need to register for the after-school care program.

Where can parent's drop-off their children in the morning?

The a.m. **drop-off point** is at the front of the school. Parents should use the far end entrance at the front of Freedom High School. Students may only be dropped-off between the posted signs in the front of the school.

- The p.m. **pick-up point** is at the front of the school. Parents should use the far end entrance at the end of Commerce Park Boulevard (in front of Freedom High School) when entering school grounds. Students may only be picked-up between the posted signs in the front of Liberty Middle School.
- Parents must form a single line of cars. Students must enter the car from the passenger side ONLY.
- Please drive slowly and use extreme caution while driving in this area.
- **Students that will be picked up from school in the afternoon must use the car line.** The lot located between Freedom and Liberty is not a pick up lot, nor is the teacher parking lot in front of the school. **Please do not drop off or attempt to pick up your children on Commerce Park Blvd, Primrose Day Care, businesses across the street, faculty parking lots (front and two sides) or the bus ramp.**
- There is no visitor parking between 4:00 p.m. – 4:45 p.m. Due to the large volume of pick-up traffic at dismissal time, parents will be unable to access visitor parking spaces located on the Liberty campus.

What if I need to pick up my student early during the last period?

Due to the traffic congestion and the high volume of activity in the main office, parents need to pick up their child **no later than 4:10p.m.**

Where can parents park when they visit the school?

- There are four visitor spots and handicapped parking located on the curved driveway in front of the school.
- Please do not park on the grass, as this may break our sprinkler heads.
- There is no visitor parking between 3:50 – 4:30 p.m. Due to the large volume of pick-up traffic at dismissal time, parents will be unable to access visitor parking spaces located on the Liberty campus.
- **How does a parent get an emergency transportation change to a student?**
- Plans regarding students' pick-up after-school must be made at home in advance, as these messages interrupt the students' instruction and learning.

How do parents make arrangements for their children to ride a different bus home just for the day?

Per the transportation department's policy, there will be no temporary bus changes made.

- All **emergency** transportation change telephone calls need to be made to the Main Office no **later than 4:00 p.m.**

Student Materials and Supplies

What are the book-bag guidelines?

- Book bags on rollers are not allowed on campus, as they are considered a safety hazard in the halls
- String book bags and book bags are permitted.

Do students need planners?

- It is the expectation of the school that all students will use some type of planner system. The student planner is an important academic tool at the middle school level, as it serves as a communication tool between home and school.
- Students may purchase Liberty student planners during homeroom the second week of school. The cost of the planner is \$5.00.

What materials do students need?

Teachers will provide students with a specific list of supplies for their classes.

What are the guidelines for textbooks?

- Failure of students to pay for lost or damaged textbooks from their previous school will result in students not being issued textbooks for the current school year. In other words, students who are currently on the debt list will not receive books until the debt is cleared with the bookkeeper.
- Students who are on the debt list are not allowed to participate in extracurricular or sports activities. Students, who do not have textbooks due to a debt, may check out a book from the teacher to use in class or take home to complete an assignment on a daily basis.

Attendance

What are the procedures for student sign-in?

- If a student arrives to school after 9:30a.m., the parent must accompany the child to the Main Office or call the outside button to allow your student to enter the school. The parent will officially sign-in the child on the attendance computer and receive a pass to class. School personnel will sign the pass. The pass will be marked *excused* or *unexcused* depending on the nature of the tardy (See Hillsborough County Schools Handbook).
- More than two sign-ins in a grading period shall require documentation or a conference with the assistant principal for the sign-in to be considered *excused*.
- Students who have unexcused tardies for first period will be subject to the tardy consequence plan.

What are the procedures for student sign-out?

- The student sign-out area is in the Main Office or use the call button in the front of school. Students may only be released to individuals listed on their emergency cards. No phone calls will be accepted.
- All adults picking up students will be required to show ID.
- All student sign-outs must occur before 4:00p.m. in order to minimize class interruptions during the last period of the day and ensure a smooth whole-school dismissal.
- More than four sign-outs in a grading period shall require documentation or a conference with the assistant principal for the sign-out to be considered *excused*.

What are the procedures if a student is absent?

- Parents should call the school (558-1180) and press “1”.
- Please call in by 10:00 a.m. daily to report an absence. In other words, if a student is ill for three days, the parent needs to call all three days (prior to 10:00 a.m.). Please give the following information: 1) Caller’s name and relationship to student, 2) Student’s legal name, 3) Student’s grade, 4) Reason for absence, and 5) Daytime telephone number where the caller can be reached for verification if deemed necessary.
- If a student has excessive *unexcused* and/or *excused* absences (eight or more) over the course of the school year, the parent will be required by an Assistant Principal to show documentation (doctor’s note, etc.) A conference with the assistant principal will be set to discuss the excessive absences. A letter will be mailed home after the eighth absence for the year.
- All absences are considered *unexcused* unless the parent calls before 10:00 a.m. on each day of the absence. *Unexcused* absences have a **negative effect on grades**, as it results in a grade of “zero” for tests and/or graded work missed. If no test and/or graded work are missed on the day of the *unexcused* absence, the student will receive a two-percent grade reduction for that day. The reduction is made at the end of the nine-week grading period and is taken from the final nine-week grade average. **Remember, students accumulate *unexcused* absences when parents do NOT call-in the absences.**

What are the procedures for getting preplanned absences excused? Are they marked excused?

- According to district policy, a preplanned absence for a personal reason that is acceptable to the school’s administration may be marked *excused*. Approval is contingent upon the reason for absence, the student’s attendance record, the student’s academic record and student’s conduct.
- For these types of absences, parents should **contact their child’s Assistant Principal for prior approval**. These types of absences must be requested and approved at least three days prior to the absence.
- Each assistant principal will notify the teachers of the excused pre-planned absence.

General Student Procedures and Practices

Can a parent walk directly to his/her child's classroom? NO

- Liberty Middle School is a closed campus.
 - According to teacher contract, teachers must receive a minimum of 24 hours notice for a parent-teacher conference.

What are the guidelines for giving student medications during school hours?

Parental/Guardian written consent is required every school year for employees to administer prescribed medication, conduct medical procedures and/or medical treatment.

Do students have to wear a uniform during PE?

- Sixth, seventh, and eighth graders dress-out for PE. Students must wear the standard Liberty PE uniforms.
- Uniforms can be purchased during PE periods. The cost of the PE uniform is \$20.00. Make checks payable to Liberty Middle PTSA.

What are the PE guidelines?

- The cost of the PE locker rental fee is \$5.00 per school year. Money for PE lockers will be collected during PE periods.
- It is the responsibility of the student to dress-out daily for PE. A note from a parent or guardian is required to temporarily excuse a student (1-3 days) from participating due to illness or injury.
- A student must submit a note from a physician for exemption from PE or restricted activity for four school days or longer.

What is the cost of breakfast and lunch?

- Breakfast and lunch is free for all students. Breakfast is served from 9:15a.m. – 9:30a.m.
- At lunchtime, students may purchase à la carte.

Dress Code

What is the dress code for Hillsborough County?

Liberty Middle School has a mandatory uniform policy.

Shoes must be worn. Skate tennis shoes and bedroom slippers, crocs, slides are unacceptable.

- **Pants/Shorts/Skirts:** Solid navy or tan khaki pants, shorts, skorts, skirts, capris, or jumpers are acceptable. Pants/shorts etc. should not have any wording/graphics down the sides or across the back. Uniform shirts are to be worn with jumpers. Pants and shorts must be secured at the waist.
- **Shirts:** Solid white, navy blue, or red polo shirt with collar; short or long sleeves. Discreet logos should be no bigger than a pocket log.
- **Liberty Spirit Fridays:** On Fridays and designated non-uniform days, students may wear blue jeans, shorts/skirts/capris with their uniform shirts or any official Liberty Spirit Shirt, grade level team shirt, or a Liberty club t-shirt. PE shirts are permitted in PE only. Jeans must be free of rips, and holes.
- Clothing traditionally designed as undergarments or sleepwear must not be worn as outer garments.
- All pants and shorts must be secured at the waist. Hair must be clean and neatly groomed.

- ⇒ Head coverings must not be worn in the building. (*In other words, hats, caps, bandanas of any kind, do-rags, etc. are not permitted on school grounds. The only time students may wear hats on school grounds is for sun protection when they are participating in an outdoor PE activity or at the Agriculture Land.*)
- Miniskirts, mini dresses and short shorts are not permitted. Hemlines must be no shorter than fingertip length.
- Garments and/or jewelry that display or suggest sexual, vulgar, drug, gang or alcohol-related wording or graphics, or which might provoke or tend to provoke student disruption in the school must not be worn. (*This includes wristbands, bandanas, spiked accessories, "gang associated" clothes, wording, or graphics about tobacco and weapons. This also includes the use of inappropriate colors of hair-dye.*)

Tardy Policy

What is the district's definition of a tardy?

According to district handbook: The student is tardy when he/she is not in his/her assigned station (seat) at the beginning of class.

What is the difference between a tardy and an absence?

According to district handbook: If a student misses more than half of the period, the student is absent.

Bullying

What is school district's definition of bullying and retaliation?

One of the district's priorities is to provide a safe, caring, and orderly environment. As a result, on May 15, 2001, the school board adopted new guidelines for dealing with students who engage in bullying and retaliation behaviors.

- *Bullying -- Unacceptable Behaviors*
 - Punching, shoving, strangling, hair pulling, beating, biting, and excessive tickling
 - Spreading rumors, hurtful name-calling, teasing and gossip, rejecting, terrorizing, extorting, humiliating, blackmailing, manipulating friendships, isolating, ostracizing, spreading rumors, and negative talk about race, disability, and/or ethnicity
 - Sexual harassment
 - Bullying may be limited to a single event or repeated harmful actions on the part of the bully
- *Retaliation – Unacceptable Behaviors*
 - Spreading rumors
 - Following a person

- Becoming physical with a person
- Destroying a person's property
- *Consequences for Bullying and Retaliation*
 - If a student is deemed guilty, the range of punishment could include verbal and written reprimand, parent conference, in-school suspension, out-of-school suspension, change of placement, and/or expulsion.

What should my child do if he/she feels like he/she is a victim of bullying?

Your child should tell an adult so the situation can be investigated. Since one of our school-wide expectations is to stamp-out bullying, these types of incidents take a priority status.

What is the *Liberty Anti-Bully Pledge* for students?

We, the students of Liberty Middle School agree to join together to stamp out bullying at our school. Bullying causes pain and stress to victims. Bullying is never justified. We believe that everyone should enjoy our school and feel equally safe, secure, and accepted.

The invited person can also login and accept the link request by clicking on the Link Account Button and selecting accept.</p>

5. Select the Sports you will participate	In the Sports Interest section, check the sports you will be trying out for. By checking these sports, you are allowing the coach of that team to view your pre-participation paperwork...
6. Additional Schools (if Applicable)	If you/your student participate in sports at multiple schools, add the additional schools here. If you/your student do not play for multiple schools, leave this section blank. Adding additional schools will allow the Athletic Director(s) at the additional school(s) view your pre-participation paperwork.
7. Complete & Sign Digital Forms	Click on each form link, complete each form, and click the Sign & Submit button. Both the parent and student must complete this step. Your school/district chooses which forms require the student, parent, or student AND parent signatures. Upon completion of each form, you should be auto promoted to the next form.
	Students with accounts may begin completing digital forms immediately. Parents must be linked to a student account to see the electronic version of the forms. 	Upload Buttons are shown when you are required to upload a document instead of completing the web-form. For example, the physical exam form your physician completes or a birth certificate. These forms can be uploaded by either the parent or student but require the parents signature.
8. Accepted Forms Notification	When your school has accepted all forms, a notification will be sent to you stating all forms have been accepted. You will be notified via email and/or text message (if you have selected the text message option during account creation), if a form has been denied by your school. You will be sent a notification, in which you will be given the reason for denial and a link to review and resubmit your changes back to the school.

STUDENT NUTRITION SERVICES EMERGENCY MEAL POLICY

A written copy of the emergency meal policy will be provided to all households. Every school is required to follow the policy. Students who qualify for a free or a reduced-priced meal can always receive a free lunch (the district waives the .40 cost for the reduced-priced meal). All students regardless of eligibility status can receive a free breakfast. Paid students who forget their lunch money can receive a "charged" meal. To protect the identity of all children at the point of service, SNS uses a prepayment system that limits the exchange of money and prevents the disclosure of a student's eligibility status.

1. Students are allowed to charge for meals when they don't have money. The student will be given the same school lunch that other children are receiving. A La Carte Items can never be charged.
2. Parents of students who charge one meal will be notified by phone, after their child has received the meal. The parent will be encouraged to quickly pay for this meal and reminded of the policy.
3. Parents of students who continue to charge will receive notification in writing which will encourage the parent to pay off their charges.
4. If a student continues to come to school with no packed lunch or lunch money, attempts will be made to discuss the issue with the parent and to encourage them to complete a meal benefit application.
5. Any time there is an uncollected balance on a child's meal account, the child will be prevented from purchasing A La Carte items.
6. Any unpaid balance on a child's account will be carried over from year to year.
7. The parent is responsible for all uncollected meal balances which must be paid, prior to graduation.

NORMAS PARA LAS COMIDAS DE EMERGENCIA DE LOS SERVICIOS DE NUTRICIÓN ESTUDIANTIL

Se proporcionará una copia de las normas de comidas de emergencia a todas las familias. A todas las escuelas se les exige que acaten estas normas. Los estudiantes que califican para obtener almuerzo gratis o a precio reducido siempre podrán recibir almuerzo gratis, (el distrito les exonerará los 40 centavos del almuerzo). Todos los estudiantes, independientemente de su elegibilidad, pueden recibir desayuno gratis. Los estudiantes que pagan el precio completo y se les olvida traer el dinero, pueden recibir comida “fiada”. Para proteger la identidad de todos los estudiantes en el momento de servirles, el Servicio de Nutrición Estudiantil (SNS) utiliza un sistema de prepago que limita el intercambio de dinero y evita que se exponga el estado de elegibilidad del estudiante.

1. A los estudiantes se les permite cargar a la cuenta por las comidas cuando no tienen dinero. Se les proveerá el mismo almuerzo que los demás niños reciben. No se fiarán los artículos a la carta.
2. A los padres se les notificará por teléfono después que el estudiante haya cargado el almuerzo y lo haya recibido. Se les exhortará a los padres que paguen inmediatamente por el almuerzo y se les enfatizará sobre las normas.
3. Los padres de los estudiantes que continúen cargando comidas a la cuenta, recibirán una notificación escrita, para exhortarlos a que paguen los cargos.
4. Si un estudiante continúa viniendo a la escuela sin su almuerzo o sin dinero para pagarla, haremos el propósito de discutir el asunto con los padres y les exhortaremos a que llenen una solicitud de beneficios para comidas.
5. Si el estudiante tiene un estado de cuenta negativo, no se le permitirá comprar artículos a la carta.
6. Los cargos no pagados se seguirán reflejando en la cuenta del estudiante en los años subsiguientes.
7. Los padres son responsables del estado de cuenta negativo el cual deberá pagar antes de la graduación.



Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn! Hillsborough County Student Nutrition Services offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast is FREE for all students. Elementary lunch costs \$2.25, and Secondary lunch costs \$2.75. **Your child may qualify for free or reduced-price meals!** The reduced-price lunch cost of 40¢ is waived (provided at no charge) for children approved for reduced price meals. Below are some commonly asked questions with answers to help you with the application process.

1. WHO CAN GET FREE OR REDUCED-PRICE MEALS?

- All children in households receiving benefits from **SNAP (food stamps)** or **TANF**, are eligible for free meals, regardless of your income. Households receiving SNAP or TANF benefits may exclude income information and the last four digits of the signer's social security number on their application.
- If you received a **NOTICE OF DIRECT CERTIFICATION**: DO NOT complete an application. Please read the entire letter and follow the instructions carefully. See #6 for more information.
- **Foster children** that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals. Foster children may be included as part of a household application, and are eligible for free meals, even if the household does not qualify.
- Children participating in their school's **Head Start** program are eligible for free meals.
- Children who meet the definition of **homeless, runaway, or migrant**, are eligible for free meals. See #9 for more information.
- Children may receive free or reduced-price meals if your **household income** is within the limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Your children may qualify for free or reduced-price meals if your household gross income falls at or below the limits on the chart below:

2. **CAN I APPLY ONLINE?** Yes! Beginning July 1st each school year, and you are encouraged to do so! Applying online is quick, confidential, and easy! The online application has the same requirements and will ask for the same information as the paper application. To apply online, visit the district website at www.hillsboroughschools.org/mealbenefits, then click "APPLY NOW", and follow the instructions. Contact the **Healthy Meals Express Application Center at 813-840-7066** if you have any questions about the online application process.
3. **IS THE ONLINE APPLICATION AVAILABLE IN MORE THAN ONE LANGUAGE?** Yes! It is available in 7 languages: English, Spanish, French, Arabic, Filipino, Vietnamese (Tiếng Việt) & Chinese (Mandarin). FOR REFERENCE ONLY you may view a SAMPLE free and reduced meal application in 49 languages here: www.fns.usda.gov/school-meals/translated-applications
4. **WHAT IF I DON'T HAVE A COMPUTER TO COMPLETE AN ONLINE APPLICATION?** Computers are available for use at no cost at the local public library and at the **Healthy Meals Express Application Center, 9014 Brittany Way, Tampa, Florida, 33619**. Your child's school may also have a computer that can be used to complete an application. Need information where to obtain a paper application? Contact the **Healthy Meals Express Application Center at 813-840-7066**.

5. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD? No. Use one meal application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. If approved, your child's status will remain in effect for the entire school year.
6. SHOULD I FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF I RECEIVED A LETTER THIS SCHOOL YEAR SAYING MY CHILDREN ARE ALREADY APPROVED FOR FREE MEALS? No, but please read the letter you received carefully and follow the instructions. If any children in your household were missing from your eligibility notification, contact the **Healthy Meals Express Application Center at 813-840-7066** immediately.
7. MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT A NEW ONE? Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year. If you do not submit a new application that is approved, or you have not received a NOTICE OF DIRECT CERTIFICATION, your child will be charged the full price for meals.
8. WHERE CAN I VERIFY THE STATUS OF MY CHILD'S MEAL ELIGIBILITY? Call **Healthy Meals Express Application Center 813-840-7066**. Make sure to have your child's 7-digit student ID number handy when calling.
9. HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILDREN QUALIFY AS HOMELESS, MIGRANT, OR RUNAWAY? Are your housing arrangements temporary? Does your family relocate on a seasonal basis? Have you taken in a runaway child? If you believe children in your household meet these descriptions, please contact the liaison at the child's school for assistance.
10. I RECEIVE WIC. CAN MY CHILDREN GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Please submit an application.
11. WILL THE INFORMATION I GIVE BE CHECKED? Yes. We may also ask you to send written proof of the household income you report.
12. IF I DON'T QUALIFY NOW, MAY I APPLY LATER? Yes, you may apply at any time during the school year if there is a change in your household income or size, or if you become unemployed.
13. WHAT IF I DISAGREE WITH THE DECISION ABOUT MY APPLICATION? Contact the **Healthy Meals Express Application Center at 813-840-7066**. You may also ask for a hearing by writing to: **General Manager of Student Nutrition Services, 9014 Brittany Way, Tampa, Florida 33619**.
14. MAY I APPLY IF SOMEONE IN MY HOUSEHOLD IS NOT A U.S. CITIZEN? Yes. You, your children, or other household members do not have to be U.S. citizens to apply for free or reduced-price meals.
15. WHAT IF MY INCOME IS NOT ALWAYS THE SAME? List the amount that you normally receive. If you normally receive overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime sometimes. If you have lost a job, or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.
16. WHAT IF SOME HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS HAVE NO INCOME TO REPORT? If there is no income to report, mark the box that says "None" for each household member. If you enter '0' or leave any fields blank, you are certifying (promising) that there is no income to report.
17. WE ARE IN THE MILITARY. DO WE REPORT OUR INCOME DIFFERENTLY? Your basic pay and cash bonuses must be reported as income. If you receive any cash value allowances for off-base housing, food, or clothing, it must also be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. Any additional combat pay resulting from deployment is also excluded from income. Deployed service members are considered part of the household. List deployed service members in the Household section, but report only the portion of their income made available to them or on their behalf to the family.
18. WHAT IF THERE ISN'T ENOUGH SPACE ON THE APPLICATION FOR MY FAMILY? Contact the **Healthy Meals Express Application Center at 813-840-7066** for instructions.
19. I'M A GROUP HOME ADMINISTRATOR. HOW DO I APPLY FOR CHILDREN IN MY CARE? Contact the **Healthy Meals Express Application Center at 813-840-7066** for instructions.

Los niños necesitan alimentos saludables para que puedan aprender! Los Servicios de Nutrición Estudiantil del Condado de Hillsborough ofrecen comidas saludables todos los días escolares. El desayuno es GRATIS para todos los estudiantes. El costo del almuerzo en las escuelas primarias es \$2.25 y para los estudiantes de las escuelas secundarias es \$2.75. **Su hijo puede ser elegible para las comidas gratis o a precio reducido.** A los estudiantes que son elegibles para comprar el almuerzo al precio reducido de 40¢ no se les cobrará.
