

Steinbrenner High School - Information Sheet 2023 – 2024

Welcome to Steinbrenner High School for the 2023 – 2024 school year! We are excited to welcome in the new year and want to provide you with all of the information you need for your student to have a successful year. Please use this sheet to answer some of the most frequent questions we receive and if you think of anything else, feel free to give us a call.

OPEN HOUSE INFORMATION:

Open House will be held on Monday, August 7th. Students in grades 10-12 are invited to attend at 9am. Students in grade 9 are invited to attend at 12:30pm. You will report to your homeroom when you arrive. Your homeroom teacher will give each student a copy of their class schedule and then you will have an opportunity to visit each of your classes. We will send out a homeroom locator via Parent Link, Canvas, Twitter and the School Website prior to August 7th.

SCHOOL HOURS:

School Hours are 8:30am until 2:25pm on Mondays (Early Release Day) and 8:30am until 3:25pm on Tuesday through Friday.

STUDENT PARKING:

Student parking at Steinbrenner is limited and therefore we only sell parking spots to Juniors and Seniors. Seniors receive first priority for parking spots and will be able to purchase their hang tags on 7/24. Remaining spots are sold to Juniors through a lottery. Juniors must register for the lottery between 7/18 – 7/21. Juniors selected in the lottery will be able to purchase their hang tags on August 1st. The link for the junior lottery will be sent out to juniors via Parent Link during the window. STUDENT DROP OFF INFORMATION:

Student drop off is located in the rear of the building. Please do not attempt to drop your student off in any other area of the school or surrounding areas (McKittrick Elementary, Martinez Middle School, TPC, front parking lot or bus ramp). We have attempted to develop a system which is efficient and safe. Please adhere to the directions of school personnel as they direct the flow of traffic. Most importantly, please be patient and please ARRIVE EARLY. This area gets very congested and the safety of our students is our top priority.

BUS STOP INFORMATION:

Bus information will be available for students on the school district website or at webquery.sdhc.k12.fl.us/livewq/webquery closer to the start of school. We will distribute bus passes the first day of school in homeroom. You can also pick up a bus pass during Open House in the cafeteria. We encourage all students eligible for transportation to consider riding the bus as it reduces the amount of traffic trying to get in and out of the school and is a reliable means for getting your student to school each day on time. PE INFORMATION:

Students enrolled in a PE course are required to dress out. Uniforms for dress out can be purchased at Open House or during the first week of school. Shirts are \$10 and shorts are also sold for \$10.

SENIOR PICTURES:

To be included in the yearbook for your senior year, you will need to get your photos taken at Cady Studios. You will have formal and personality photos taken. Please make your appointment online at cady.com. Book your appointment soon, to make your yearbook deadline, as they are filling up quickly!

UNDERCLASSMEN PICTURES:

Picture day for underclassmen is scheduled for August 23rd. Order information will be distributed prior to Picture Day. Make up / Retake pictures will be scheduled for October 5th.

COMMUNICATION:

Our phone system has advantages and disadvantages. When calling the school, the automated message gives the caller the option of selecting either an office area or the extension of the person sought. Teachers have access to phones in teacher planning areas but not in individual classrooms. There are seven outgoing lines for the entire staff. Finding an available phone and an available line is sometimes a challenge. E-MAIL can be a much timelier communication for almost all teachers and can be accessed and answered from the classroom. Please do not expect teachers to read or respond to e-mails during class time.

All teachers will give a comprehensive syllabus the first day of school to your student. The syllabus will give important information about the teacher's grading policy, the teacher's policy on make up work and the best way to get in touch with the teacher.

Steinbrenner High School uses Canvas as our learning management system. This system is a valuable tool for providing students with online resources, providing a communication portal between teachers, students and parents and as a way for parents to monitor student grades. In order to save our resources, we will send out a weekly update parent link as well as a monthly newsletter. You will receive the link for the newsletter by e-mail via our Parent Link system. We will also post the newsletter on our website.

TEXTBOOKS:

One thing we learned from Covid was that many of our students prefer online resources. Where possible, we will give students access to online resources in lieu of a physical textbook so that it can be accessed from any computer. Some classes will distribute textbooks individually and others may have students use class sets in the classroom. If a textbook is checked out to your student, we encourage you to protect the book as most textbooks cost over \$50 each.

LUNCHES:

Breakfast is free for all students and is served daily from 7:50am – 8:20am. School lunches are \$2.75 for a standard school lunch. A variety of a la carte options are also available for purchase each day. Parents may pre-pay student lunches by sending money in person with their student to add to their account or by going on the district website and selecting Meal Pre-Pay. Students will receive information regarding applications for free and reduced lunch electronically throughout the summer. If you feel you qualify, please apply.

SCHEDULE CHANGES:

Student schedules will be available on Canvas no later than August 4th. The schedule is based on the requests that students made last year. Hiring decisions and teachers' schedules have been made based upon these requests. It is important that you understand it is extremely difficult and sometimes impossible for us to make adjustments to the schedule you have received.

If you feel there is a problem with your schedule (ie. you are missing a period, you are scheduled for a class you already passed) and you believe a change needs to be made, please complete an online schedule change request at the following link:

Schedule changes will not be handled during Open House. If you request a change and we are able to accommodate your request, you will receive the new version of your schedule in homeroom on the first day of school.

ATHLETIC BOOSTER CLUB:

CELL PHONE POLICY:

Cell phone use will be permitted this year before and after school, during lunch and during the change of classes. Cell phone use during class should only be for instructional purposes and at the discretion of the teacher. Students who use a cell phone during class time without permission from the teacher will have the phone confiscated. On the first offense, the student will receive a warning and be able to get their phone back at the end of the school day. On the second offense, the phone will be confiscated and a parent will have to pick up the phone. Beginning with the third offense, the phone will be confiscated for parent pick up and the student will receive disciplinary consequences for willful disobedience. A student who refuses to relinquish their phone to a teacher will receive disciplinary consequences.

DRESS CODE POLICY:

All students are expected to adhere to the dress code in the Student Code of Conduct on the Hillsborough County Public Schools website. Students should be aware that hats and hoodies are not permitted on campus. Short shorts and mini-skirts are not permitted. Strapless shirts, spaghetti strap shirts and shirts that expose the midriff are not permitted. Undergarments should not be exposed. The Office of Student Affairs will go over the specifics of the dress code with students during orientation the first week of school. Violations of dress code will result in a loss of instructional time as students will not be permitted to remain in class until their clothing is in compliance with district regulations. Repeated violations of the dress code will result in disciplinary consequences.

ATTENDANCE AND TARDY INFORMATION:

Consistent attendance is imperative to the academic success of our students. Please ensure that your student attends school daily and arrives to class on time. In the event that a student must miss school due to illness, please call our attendance line at 792-5131 and press 1 from our automated menu. Be aware that when a student is absent, you will receive a phone call from the school notifying you of the absence. Students who miss school frequently are likely to fall behind in their classes. Absences and tardies may also impact their ability to play sports or participate in clubs and can potentially even cause them to lose their driving privileges.
